#### HISTORY.

Following upon the great popularity of the original Ping-Pong in the early part of the present century, the Ping-Pong Association was formed in 1902, to organise championships and tournaments, chiefly in London. The "boom" year was 1904 but it was only a temporary craze, as, although the P.P.A. was still in existence in 1905, it appears to have collapsed during that season. Whilst the game seems to have died out in the home counties, it was apparently still being played in the provinces but without any governing body.

In 1921-22, the P.P.A. was resuscitated by Messrs. P. Bromfield and J. J. Payne, who were joined by Hon. Ivor Montagu, Mr. J. M. Rose and Mr. A. F. Carris. The National Championships were run that season, and entries received from all parts of the country. Difficulties soon arose, however, not only in regard to the title, when it was discovered that Ping-Pong was a registered trade name, but also through the Association being unrepresentative of the provincial centres. The old Ping-Pong Association therefore dissolved and re-formed under the title of "The Table Tennis Association." The new body was hampered by difficulties, and as their energies were devoted to formulating standard rules, popularising the game, etc., no attempt to form a democratic governing body could be made.

At the Annual Meeting in 1925, an emergency committee, with Mr. Montagu as President, and Mr. W. J. Pope as Secretary, were authorised to redraft the constitution. In 1926, revised regulations were circularised in the provinces and a National Delegate Conference was held in London, on April 24th, 1927. The new constitution, which confirmed the provisional appointments, and provided tor the new title, "The English Table Tennis Association." was adopted.

The first Chairman and Secretary were, of course, Mr. Montagu and Mr. Pope, respectively. They stayed in office for some years, and were together primarily responsible for establishing the new national body on sound foundations. They worked prodigiously hard until Mr. H. M. Bunbury, of Manchester, assumed the Chairmanship in 1929, Mr. Montagu being appointed President. Mr. D. W. Poupard became Secretary one year later, after Mr. B. L. Hookins, of Pontefract, had had a brief term. Mr. H. Oldroyd, also of Manchester, was elected President in 1931, and still retains very worthily the dignity of his office. Mr. Montagu returned to the chair in 1932, with Mr. G. W. Decker as Secretary; these two being succeeded in September, 1933, by Mr. C. Corti Woodcock, of London, and Mr. J. Siddron, of Manchester, respectively. The last-mentioned appointments were renewed in April, 1934, together with that of Mr. A. K. Vint, of Hastings, Hon Treasurer since 1931. In April, 1935, Mr. Woodcock and Mr. Vint were re-elected and Mr. W. J. Pope displaced Mr. J. Siddron as Secretary, and in 1936 Mr. Woodcock resigned and was replaced by Mr. Montagu. Interesting names appearing on the list of Vice-Presidents include Messrs. Bunbury, Bromfield and Perry (father of our ex-world champion, Fred J. Perry). In the last groups recently elected, were further valuable additions in the persons of the Dowager Lady Swaythling, Mr. A. F. Carris and Mr. P. E. Warden.

The progress of the E.T.T.A. dating from the inaugural congress has been very rapid as the following figures reveal. 1927-28, 19 Leagues; 1928-29, 21; 1929-30, 23; 1930-31, 32; 1931-32, 38; 1932-33, 52; 1933-34, 71. In the season 1934-35, we jumped to 99 Leagues, 1,654 Clubs, and approximately 30,000 individual registered members, and in 1936, 121

League Clubs with approximately 40,000 members. Of the 22 National Table Tennis Associations comprising the International Federation, ours is by far the largest, as indeed it is also the biggest of all indoor sports organisations in this country at the present time. The game is now part and parcel of the life, interest and exercise of English men and women of all ages.

In 1935, after an interval of eight years, the World Championships Congress returned to England The E.T.T.A. was faced not only with a gigantic task. but with a vital responsibility to the visiting foreigners, the players and the public. The result is now history, and the great crowds which thronged the London University and Imperial Institute and the huge assembly of over 8,000 people which packed the Empire Pool & Sports Arena, Wembley, proved that the game had won its place in public favour as a thrilling spectacle.

In 1936, the Empress Stadium at Earl's Court housed a crowd of 7,000 people for the Finals of our National Championships and in February, 1937, the Empire Pool and Sports Arena was again filled. The fact that during that season there was an increased affiliation of 52 Leagues, with approximately 500 Clubs shows that the appeal is permanent and progressive and Season 1937-38 witnessed the affiliation of another 48 Leagues, to bring the total to 206 Leagues with approximately 80,000 members. Once again the World Championships came to London and the preliminaries packed the Albert Hall every night. Excursions from all over England made up another great 9,000 attendance on Finals night at the Wembly Arena, and the E.T.T.A. set up the highest standard for organisation and conditions. Prospects of development are just as bright for this season.

#### RULES AND REGULATIONS.

NAME.

- The Association shall be called the English Table Tennis Association, and shall be affiliated to the International Table Tennis Federation.
  - OBJECTS. The objects of the Association shall be as follows:
  - (a) To lay down and secure the adoption of uniform laws in England and to act as the legislative authority.
  - (b) To decide all doubtful or disputed questions as to the laws and all matters relating to the game in England.
    (c) To act as the sole controlling and governing body of
  - the game of Table Tennis in England.

CONSTITUTION.

- 3. The Association shall consist of President, Vice-Presidents and duly elected Officers, local Associations, Leagues, Clubs and Individual Members, all being duly affiliated and registered.
- QUALIFICATION FOR MEMBERSHIP. 4. Any local Association, League, Club or an individual player playing the game under the laws of the Association shall be eligible for affiliation.

ELECTION.

5. Every applicant for membership of the Association shall complete the affiliation form, in force for the time being, and shall sign same on his behalf or on behalf of the local Association, League or Club for whom application is being

SUBSCRIPTIONS.

- 6. The annual subscription shall be as follows: (a) Leagues and local Associations-3/6 for each Club affiliated to the League or local Association.
- (b) Clubs-7/6 for each Club affiliating directly, whether a member of a local Association League or not.
- (c) Individuals-2/6 for individuals desiring personal
- (d) Organisations—Special organisations may be accepted into good standing, at the discretion of the National Executive Committee.

- 7. All subscriptions shall be paid to the Hon. General Secretary of the Association not later than October 15th each year. Affiliated local Associations, Leagues Clubs or individuals shall be held liable for their subscriptions for the succeeding season if they shall not have given notice of withdrawal from the Association before September 15th in any year.
- 8. A copy of the Association's current Handbook when published shall be supplied free of charge to every affiliated Club.

OFFICERS.

- 9. The Honorary Officers of the Association shall be, a President, Chairman, General Secretary, and Treasurer. The Association shall have power further to elect Hon. Assistant Secretaries, and Hon. Assistant Treasurers. All Officers shall retire annually, but shall be eligible for re-election. The National Executive Committee shall have power to create and fill any other office which in its opinion is necessary and be at liberty to remunerate any officer who is not appointed in an honorary basis.
- 10. Notice of retirement from the position of any Office shall be sent to the Hon. General Secretary, one month before the date of the Annual General Meeting.

GENERAL COUNCIL.

- (a) The control of the affairs of the Association shall be vested in a General Council consisting of the President, Chairman, Hon. Treasurer and Hon. General Secretary (these to be ex-officio members) and one representative appointed by each affiliated league, who shall be responsible for the nomination and election of the Officers of the Association and National Executive Committee with the exception of the President.
- (b) A meeting of the Council shall be convened on a resolution of the National Executive Committee, or within fourteen days of receipt by the Hon. General Secretary of a resolution signed by at least one-quarter of the members of the Council.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

(a) The affairs of the Association shall be managed by a National Executive Committee consisting of the President, Chairman, Hon. Treasurer and Hon. General Secretary, eight men bers elected annually by the General Council, and not more than three women members co-opted annually by the National Executive Committee. The National Executive Committee shall have power to co-opt not more than two other members of the Association.

- (b) The quorum necessary for the transaction of the business of the Committee may be fixed by the Committee and unless so fixed, shall be five.
- (c) Except as herein otherwise provided, every question at a meeting of the Committee shall be determined by a majority of the votes of the members present and voting, every member having one vote, and in the case of an equality of votes the Chairman of the meeting shall have a second or casting vote.
- (d) The Committee may delegate any of its duties to Committees consisting of such persons as it thinks fit. Any Committee so formed shall, in the performance of the duties so delegated, conform to any regulations that may be imposed on it by the National Executive Committee.
- (e) The Committee shall have power to fill casual vacancies in the membership of the Committee, but any member or members so appointed shall hold office only until the next Annual General Meeting of the Association.
- (i) Forms of nomination for the election of officers of the Association, except the President, shall be forwarded by the Hon. General Secretary to all members of the General Council at least twenty-eight days before the date fixed for holding the Annual General Meeting. Each member of the Council shall be entitled to nominate as many persons as there are vacancies to be filled, and no more. No nomination will be effective unless received by the Hon. General Secretary within seven days of the issue of the nomination paper.

(ii) For the nomination of members of the Committee, similar procedure shall be adopted as in Section (i) above, except that only those persons are eligible for nomination who are members of the General Council.

(g) The voting for the election of members of the Committee and officers of the Association, except the President, shall be by postal vote (if there are more valid nominations than vacancies to be filled), which shall be conducted in such manner as the General Council may from time to time determine. Each member of the Council shall be entitled to vote for as many candidates as there are vacancies to be filled and no more and no less. Scrutineers shall be appointed by the Council to determine any question as to the validity of nomination papers, and ascertain the result of any postal vote held under the provisions of this rule.

FINANCE.

13. The financial year of the Association shall end on June 30th, and an audited statement of accounts up to and including this date, shall be published annually.

14. The funds of the Association shall be lodged at a bank, and all cheques, drafts, etc., drawn on the account shall be signed by either the Chairman and Hon. Treasurer, or Hon. General Secretary and Hon. Treasurer.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING.

15. The Annual General Meeting of the Association shall be held in the last week in April or the first week in May, when the annual report of the National Executive Committee and statement of accounts made up to March 31st, or a subsequent date, shall be presented.

(a) At least fourteen days' notice specifying the place, the date and hour, together with the agenda, shall be given to all affiliated local Associations, Leagues, Clubs, directly affiliated Clubs and Individuals.

(b) Each affiliated League shall be entitled to send two, and each directly affiliated Club one delegate to be present at the Annual General Meeting. Attendance at the A.G.M. shall be open to all affiliated members.

(c) Resolutions affecting the Rules and all matters concerning the constitution and welfare of the Association to be subject to block voting.

(d) Other matters may be decided by voting on a show of

hands at the discretion of the Chairman.

(e) In block voting each directly affiliated Club shall be entitled to one vote, each affiliated League to a number of votes equal to one-half of its affiliated club strength. or to the nearest higher whole number, but no directly affiliated individual is entitled to a vote.

(f) Proxies will only be recognised if they have been given in writing, and refer to a specific decision on a

specific resolution proposed.

(g) A majority in excess of opposition of one-third of the votes represented in person, or by proxy, shall be necessary to carry any resolution in respect of the Rules and Regulations of the Association. Other resolutions shall be decided by simple majority and, in the event of a tie, excepting financial questions, the meeting shall proceed to the next business. In the matter of finance, the Chairman shall have a casting vote.

(h) A local association, league, club, or Individual member who has not paid any affiliation fee due to the Association shall not be entitled to be represented, present, or to vote at any meeting or take any part in the

business of the Association.

It shall be the duty of the Annual General Meeting to elect the President and Auditors, who shall take office from the day following the meeting.

(j) The Vice-Presidents of the Association shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting, but only on the recommendation of the National Executive Committee.

SPECIAL GENERAL MEETING.

16. A Special General Meeting of the Association shall be convened on a resolution of the National Executive Committee, or within one month of receipt by the Hon. General Secretary of a resolution signed by the authorised representatives of at least one-third of the Leagues, and Rule 15 respecting circulation of notices and procedure shall apply as at the A.G.M.

COUNTY ADMINISTRATION.

17. Where it is mutually desired by Associations or Leagues, an Area or County body may be formed for administrative purposes, subject to the approval of, and any regulations formulated by, the National Executive Committee. An Area or County body may function and have complete autonomy in organising and administering the game in its area but shall have no power to alter the Rules of the game or the Rules and Regulations of the Association, or to override the decisions of the National Executive Committee.

ALTERATION OF RULES.

18. No addition to, or alteration or rescission of, the Rules shall be effected unless at the Annual General Meeting or at a Special General Meeting convened for the purpose. Any proposed addition to, or alteration or rescission of, the Rules shall be submitted in writing to the Hon. General Secretary before March 31st, or together with the demand for a Special General Meeting.

19. In the event of any question or matter arising which is not provided for in the foregoing Rules, such question or matter shall be dealt with by the National Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.

GENERAL REGULATIONS.

- 20. No registered player or club may take part in competition with any player or club, or in exhibition at any club, or under any auspices not registered or affiliated to the International Table Tennis Federation, without the sanction of a member of the National Executive Committee, which must be notified to the Hon. General Secretary within seven days of such sanction.
- 21. No registered player may permit a cinematographic record of himself or herself to be taken on standard stock in connection with Table Tennis unless sanction has first been obtained from one of the Officers of the Association.
- 22 No player may receive, or affiliated body pay, any expenses or reward for playing table tennis (other than as provided for in the Association's regulations dealing with the

Registered Player) unless sanction has been previously obtained from the National Executive Committee.

- (a) No player may enter into a contract in return for capitalising his skill at table tennis without the sanction of the National Executive Committee.
- (b) No player may enter into any contract providing for his exclusive use of certain materials or exclusive play on certain premises controlled by a Firm, in any circumstances.
- 23. In all tournaments and matches sanctioned by the National Executive Committee, players are prohibited from wearing white or light coloured clothes that might, in the opinion of the duly appointed referee, tend to unsight an opponent, and all competitors under the control of the Association must wear a sports shirt of single colour (except for a badge of reasonable size) and rubber shoes. Men must wear grey flannel trousers or shorts, and women grey flannel skirts, trousers or shorts. If a cardigan is worn whilst playing it must be the same shade of colour as the shirt.
- 24. Players representing the Association in an International or other representative match must wear the regulation dress as instructed by the National Executive Committee.
  - OPEN TOURNAMENTS.
  - 25. The following rules apply to Open Tournaments:(a) No Open Tournament to be held without the sanction of the National Executive Committee, and application to hold such tournament must be made before December 31st in each season.
  - (b) All competitors must be affiliated members of the E.T.T.A. or I.T.T.F.
  - (c)  $12\frac{1}{2}\%$  of all entry fees must be remitted by the Tournament Secretary to the Hon. General Secretary of the Association together with a complete list of entrants and their clubs (if any) and a record of the results of each event including details of the final and semi-final matches, within fourteen days of the completion of the tournament.

21

- (d) No seeding shall be permitted in any Open Tournament except that, by permission of the National Executive Committee, not more than four entries in any single event and two entries in any doubles, nominated by a National Association, may be drawn in separate quarters.
- (e) At all tournaments and matches the decision of the referee appointed by the Committee in charge shall be final on a question of law, the decision of the umpire shall be final on a question of fact, and the decision of the end umpire, if appointed, shall be final on a question of fact relating to the purpose for which he was appointed.
- (f) The make of the ball to be used, number of tables, and distance (in feet) of run-back from ends of tables to be clearly stated on all entry forms.

#### NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS.

- 26. The English National Championships shall be held once every year.
- (a) The date and venue shall be fixed and notice of same circulated as in Rule 15, clause (a), not later than December 31st in each year.
- (b) The closing date for entries shall be 14 days before the opening date of the Championships.
- (c) Five Championships shall be held, as follows: Men's Singles, Men's Doubles, Women's Singles, Women's Doubles, and Mixed Doubles; and in addition a Men's Consolation Singles event for competitors eliminated in the first two played rounds of the Men's Singles Championship. A walkover but not a bye shall rank as a played round.
- (d) All matches in the Championships shall be the best of five games and in the additional Men's Singles event the best of three games.
- (e) Rule 24, Clauses (b), (d), (e), and (f) shall also apply.

#### STANDING ORDERS.

#### EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

- 1. The National Executive Committee shall be composed as provided for in Rule 12.
- 2. A Meeting of the National Executive Committee shall be authorised by the Chairman.
- 3. The National Executive Committee shall meet not less than three times during the period, September 1st—April 30th.
- 4. The Hon. General Secretary shall convene, attend and take, and submit for confirmation minutes of all meetings of the Association, Council and Committees (unless otherwise directed by the National Executive Committee as far as the Committees are concerned) and conduct the correspondence of the Association. He shall act on all occasions under the direction of the National Executive Committee.
- 5. The Hon. General Secretary shall send due notice of the meeting to every member of the Committee and the Agenda stating business to be transacted, at least 7 days before the date fixed.
- 6. At each meeting of the National Executive Committee, the Chairman shall preside, or in his absence, a Chairman for the meeting shall be elected from the members present.
- 7. The Chairman's decision upon all points of order shall be final.
- 8. The administration of the Rules and Regulations of the Association shall be vested solely in the National Executive Committee who shall:
  - (a) Decide all questions of laws and other matters relating to the game save those involving an alteration in the Rules of the Association.

2:

- (b) Decide all matters relating to International and representative matches, teams, conferences, etc., as affecting the Association.
- (c) Sanction Open Tournaments.
- (d) Decide all questions of suspension of players or Clubs for any breach of the Rules and Regulations substantiated by duly verified documentary evidence, provided any suspended player or clubs, shall have the right of appeal to the Committee.
- All applications for membership of the Association shall National be submitted to the Executive Committee for confirmation.
- 10. A bi-monthly report of the activities of the National Executive Committee shall be forwarded to each member of the General Council.
- 11. Each Sub-Committee appointed by the National Executive Committee shall elect its own Chairman and Secretary (where necessary), one of whom will be responsible for presenting to the National Executive Committee, at its ensuing meeting, the report of each Sub-Committee.
- 12. The Hon. General Secretary shall render at each meeting a brief report as to the activities of the Association during the preceding period.
- 13. The Hon. Treasurer shall submit at each meeting a financial statement showing monies received and expended during the preceding period, together with cash in hand and at bank.
- 14. The Hon. General Secretary (or Assistant Secretary) shall forward to all Officers and members, a copy of the Minutes within 14 days of the meeting.
- 15. The Hon. Treasurer shall be responsible for all monies received by the Association from whatever source derived. He (or the Hon. General Secretary) shall issue receipt for same on the official form, and shall pay all the liabilities of the Association as directed by the National Executive Committee so far as the funds available will permit.

#### REGULATIONS FOR REGISTERED PLAYERS.

- 1. PAYMENT TO PLAYERS.—(a) A player who wishes to receive payment for playing (in other than competitive events), giving lessons in, devising equipment for, writing comments on, or in any other way connected with the game shall make application on the prescribed form to the Secretary of the League of which he or she is a member.
- (b) The application shall be considered by the League Committee which shall submit a recommendation thereon to the English Table Tennis Association within one month of the application.
- (c) In the event of a player not being a member of a League, the application (and all other matters relating thereto) shall be made to the Association, which will refer it for comment to the League to which the applicant last previously belonged, prior to considering the application.
- (d) If the applicant be considered suitable, he or she will be registered by the Assocation on receipt of a fee of £1.
- (e) The registration shall be considered to be in force for the currency of the E.T.T.A. year (1st July—30th June) or for a less period Registration for a less period shall be renewable by the Association during the current year, and in the event of non-renewal a proportionate part of the fee shall be returned.
- (f) Every registered player shall conform to any regulation laid down by the League of which he or she is a member, subject to any regulation not conflicting with the regulations of the E.T.T.A.
- (g) No registered player may take part in competition with any player or club, or in exhibition at any club, or under any auspices, not registered or affiliated to the E.T.T.A. without the sanction of the Association to be applied for to the Association Secretary not less than 14 days prior to the proposed competition or exhibition.
- (h) Registered players may allow their names to be used only on articles written, and goods designed or supervised and approved by

- (i) Registered players may not enter into any contract to provide for the exclusive use of certain goods or materials, or exclusive play on premises controlled by a firm, in any circumstances.
- (j) Registered players shall not receive any remuneration other than bare expenses (return fare, botel accommodation, and reasonable meals) for playing in a competitive event in any circumstances. A competitive event is defined as a representative match or an open tournament, santioned by the E.T.T.A.
- PRIZES—No single prize or reward of more than £3 in value, shall be given or received without the sanction of the E.T.T.A.
   Prizes up to this amount may be given for Invitation or Open Competition without specific permission, provided the event itself is authorised.
- 3. Betting.—Betting in any shape or form on players or matches is strictly prohibited.
- 4. Penalty.—Any infringement of these regulations will render the players and/or organisers of events at which players appear liable to suspension for a period to be decided by the Association.

WARNING.—Players who play abroad under auspices affiliated to the International Federation are subject, as far as payment and other matters are concerned, to the regulations of the Association governing the country where they play. In addition to observing the regulations of the E.T.T.A., therefore, every player is advised to ascertain that his Table Tennis activity abroad conforms to the regulations of the governing body of the country concerned. Further, every player is advised to ascertain that the auspices under which he plays are properly affiliated to, and acting in accordance with the decisions of, an Association in membership with the I.T.T.F. Finally, every player is advised not to enter into any contract in this country which may oblige him or her, whether by distribution there of goods marked by his or her name or in any other manner, to be the participant in infringement of the regulations of the governing body of any Nation in membership with the I.T.T.F. Disregard of this warning may render a player liable to penalty of another Association, confirmed by the E.T.T.A. at its request.

While each tie as thus defined shall consist of nine matches, if all nine shall not be played owing to lateness of time or other adequate cause agreed by the referee, this shall not invalidate the match, provided the one league shall have won a majority.

4. The order of play in a Wilmott Cup match shall be as follows: where the three players on one side are numbered A. B. C., and the three players on the other side are numbered X. Y. Z.:—

1st—A v. X; 2nd—B v. Y; 3rd—C v. Z; 4th—B v. X;
5th—A v. Z; 6th—C v. Y; 7th—B v. Z; 8th—C v. X;

Before the commencement of the match the right of being A. B. C. or X.Y.Z. shall be decided by the two captains by lot; and, this decided, each captain shall name his team to the referee, allotting a letter to each of his three players. The order of play thus determined may only be altered by mutual agreement between the captains and with consent of the referee.

#### PLAYING CONDITIONS-

13. The ball used shall be the ball currently adopted by the I.T.T.F. for use in the Swaythling Cup Competition in that season.

14. The minimum playing space provided by the Home team shall be forty feet by twenty feet.

15. A referee for each tie shall be appointed by the Home team before its commencement.

16. All applicable regulations for the time being in force of the E.T.T.A. for Open Competitions shall be in force for the Wilmott Cup Competition. EXPENSES-

17. The expenses of each tie shall be defined in the following manner: Visitors' expenses (cost of fares for party not exceeding four); Home expenses (cost of provision for the occasion of hall, lighting, tables, nets, balls, printing and postage up to £1, hospitality for party not exceeding four).

Each league shall be responsible for paying its expenses as Visitor or Home league, but, on the gross receipts of each tie (a) the first charge shall be 75 per cent. of Visitors' expenses, (b) the second charge shall be 25 per cent. of Visitors' expenses and the whole of Home expenses in proportion.

Any profit shall be divided 75 per cent. to the Home League and 25 per cent. to the Visitor League. 19. Provided that if the Committee excercise its power, as set out in Regulation 9b, to order ...... of the last four ties to be played upon a neutral table, the E.T.T.A. shall be responsible for the whole of Visitors' Expenses and Home Expenses as defined in Regulation 18 above, and shall take the whole profits, less ten per cent. to each of the competing leagues.

20. A league having the right to play a tie at Home (see Rule 10), shall notify the E.T.T.A. Secretary and the Visitor league of its acceptance or non-acceptance of responsibility for the tie at Home, not later than three days (not including Sunday) following circularisation of the draw for that round, on penalty of disqualification for that season. In the event of non-acceptance, the right to play at Home shall then pass to the team originally drawn as Visitor, who shall notify its acceptance of responsibility for the tie at Home to the E.T.T.A. Secretary and the team originally drawn at Home, not later than one week following circulation of the draw for that round. In the event of neither team accepting responsibility for conducting the tie at Home, the tie shall be awarded to the team originally possessing the right to play at Home, on receipt of its claim by the E.T.T.A. Secretary.

#### GOVERNMENT-

21. The competition shall be managed by a sub-committee duly appointed for that purpose by the E.T.T.A. and the decision of that sub-committee shall be final on all matters arising out of these rules.

22. The sub-committee shall have power to extend the intervals between playing of rounds laid down in Rule 12, according to the number of entries for the competition in each season. The dates for the later rounds decided by the sub-committee shall be circularised at the same time as the draw for the preliminary and first rounds. These dates may be decred thereafter only at request of all captains concerned in the tie to be altered and by consent of the sub-committee.

23. These Rules may be altered only at an A.G.M. of the E.T.T.A. and by consent of a simple majority of a Trustee Committee consisting of the following persons or their nominees: H. M. BUNBURY, IVOR MONTAGU, W. J. POPE, A. J. WILMOTT, C. C. WOODCOCK.

1. The competition shall be open to teams representing Leagues and Clubs and paying an entry fee of 2/6 for each round in which they are drawn

2. Each league shall be represented in each tie by not more than four players; each round shall consist of a tie of four singles and a doubles match; each match shall be the best of three games 21 up; the league winning the majority of matches to be the winner of the tie.

3. While each tie as thus defined shall consist of five matches, if all five shall not be played owing to lateness of time or other adequate cause agreed by the Referee, this shall not invalidate the match, provided the one league shall have won a majority.

4. The order of play in a "Rose Bowl" match shall be as follows: Two singles matches, then the doubles match, followed by the remaining two singles.

5. Before the commencement of the singles matches the two players selected by each Captain to take part shall be named by him (or her) to the Referee in sealed nomination and the Referee shall decide the opposition and order of play or the four singles matches by lot, provided that each player so selected to play in the singles matches shall play one opponent in the first pair of singles matches and the other opponent in the second pair of singles.

Before the commencement of the doubles match, the pair selected by each Captain to take part shall be named by him (or her) to the Referee in sealed nomination.

#### QUALIFICATION-

6. Any league affiliated with the E.T.T.A. may send in an entry to the Secretary of the E.T.T.A. within a date to be determined.

7. Any Woman player shall be qualified to represent a league if she is a registered member of that league, ordinarily residing or having given notice to the E.T.T.A. Secretary before play or her bona fide intention to reside (minimum period six months) in creat Britain and shall not previously have represented any other League in the competition in that season.

- The account of its expenses, and the gross takings, shall be forwarded by the responsible official of the League concerned to the E.T.T.A. Secretary within one week of the playing of the tie. Failure to fulfil this shall render the offending league liable to disqualification in the current or succeeding seasons, and a continued failure shall be reported for suitable action to the Disciplinary Committee of the
- Provided that if the Committee exercise its power, as set out in Regulation 9b, to order ...... of the last four ties to be played upon a neutral table, the E.T.T.A. shall be responsible for the whole of Visitors' Expenses and Home Expenses as defined in Regulation 18 above, and shall take the whole profits, less ten per cent. to each of the competing leagues."
- 20. A league having the right to play a tie at Home (see Rule 10), shall notify the E.T.T.A. Secretary and the Visitor league of its acceptance or non-acceptance of responsibility for the tie at Home, not later than three days (not including Sunday) following circularisation of the draw for that round, on penalty of disqualification for that season. In the event of non-acceptance, the right to play at Home shall then pass to the team originally drawn as Visitor, who shall notify its acceptance of responsibility for the tie at Home to the E.T.T.A. Secretary and the team originally drawn at Home, not later than one week following circulation of the draw for that round. In the event of neither team accepting responsibility for conducting the tie at Home, the tie shall be awarded to the team originally possessing the right to play at Home, awarded to the team originally possessing the right to play at Home, on receipt of its claim by the E.T.T.A. Secretary.

#### GOVERNMENT.

- 21. The competition shall be managed by a sub-committee duly appointed for that purpose by the E.T.T.A. and the decision of that sub-committee shall be final on all matters arising out of these rules.
- 22. The sub-committee shall have power to extend the intervals between playing of rounds laid down in Rule 12, according to the number of entries for the competition in each season. The dates for the later rounds decided by the sub-committee shall be circularised at the same time as the draw for the preliminary and first rounds. 





The Executive Committee have pleasure in presenting the following report on the work which has been undertaken on behalf of the Association since the last Annual General Meeting:—

1. Membership.—The present membership of the Association is as follows:—

2. MEETINGS.—The Executive Committee have met on six occasions and the General Council, once. The following members were co-opted to the Committee in accordance with Rule 12 (a):—

It is with regret that we record the death of Mr. J. W. Swann of Manchester on the 11th February, 1938. Mr. Swann who was an old and valued friend of the Association joined the Executive Committee on the formation of the Manchester League in 1927. We have lost a loyal colleague and fine worker.

3. Selection Committee.—A Selection Committee consisting of Messrs. Montagu, Pope, Hills, Emdin, Goldstein, Foulis and P. Bromfield was appointed at the commencement of the season.

In an endeavour to obtain the best players in the country for the Swaythling and Corbillon Cup teams, trials were held for men and women. The country was divided into five areas and as a result of games played in these districts, final trials were held in London.

G. V. Barna offered his services to the Association to coach a number of players provided his expenses were met. The Committee accepted this generous offer and there is no doubt the training given by Barna has proved the importance of our players receiving a course of physical training,

5. WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS.—The World Championships were held in London from the 24th to the 31st January, 1938. The Swaythling and Corbillon Cup matches and the preliminary rounds of the Individual events were played at the Royal Albert Hall and the Finals at the Empire Pool and Sports Arena at Wembley.

A special committee was appointed to undertake the task of organising the Championships and without question the gigantic success of the event was due largely to the excellent work carried out by this committee.

A men's team and a women's team were entered by the Association for the Swaythling and Corbillon Cup Competitions. In the Swaythling Cup the men's team were concerned in a triple tie in Group 1 but in the play-off they were defeated by Austria and the U.S.A. The women's team were placed second out of ten teams in the Corbillon Cup Competition.

The Executive wishes to place on record their congratulations to Miss W. Woodhead on the occasion of becoming the first English Woman player to win, in partnership, a World title.

7. OPEN TOURNAMENTS.—Thirty-seven Open Tournaments were santioned by the Committee. The question of allocating Tournaments as between Major and Minor events was considered but owing to a better system of allocating dates being introduced this season, it was decided not to proceed with the proposal.

8. WILMOTT CUP COMPETITION.—Forty-nine entries were received for the Wilmott Cup Competition. The semi-finals and the final were played at Liverpool on the 9th April, 1938.

Manchester, who beat Liverpool in the final were presented with the Cup by Mr. A. J. Wilmott.

9. Foreign Players' Tour.—A tour of Foreign players was arranged immediately following the National Championships. The players taking part were Barna, Bellak, Bergmann

Liebster and Vana and they visited 36 centres. It is estimated they played before 50,000 spectators. The Committee wish to place on record their appreciation of the sporting way in which the players have undertaken the tour. For nearly three months they have travelled up and down the country with hardly a break and it is to these players we owe a debt of gratitude for giving the centres the opportunity to witness the best players in the world.

- 10. PATRON OF THE ASSOCIATION.—The Committee record with great pleasure that during the year H.M. The King graciously consented to be the Patron of the Association.
- 11. REGISTERED PLAYERS.—As a result of an instruction at the last Annual General Meeting the Committee appointed a sub-Committee to consider the regulations governing the registered player. The regulations were revised and in future Leagues will recommend players for registration. Seventeen players have registered this season.
- 12. Magazine "Table Tennis."—The Magazine has had eight issues during the year. The Committee approved the publication of a full-sized Magazine with a suitable cover and as a result the circulation has increased from 3,000 to an average of 9,000 per month.

The Committee desire to express their thanks to Mr. Murphy, Mr. J. Conolly, Mr. W. C. Charlton, Miss R. Smits, Miss G. Capper and Miss B. Capper for the splendid work they have done in connection with the publication.

13. Central, Administration.—Your Committee has given constant attention to the general development of the administrative side of the game and during the course of the year they have periodically engaged additional clerical assistance to cope with the extra pressure which is inevitable at certain periods of the season.

The Committee regret to report that Mr. L. E. Forrest has resigned his position as Assistant Secretary. Mr. Forrest who has obtained another appointment has serve the Association faithfully during the past two years, and it is desired to

place on record keen appreciation of his service. Mrs. M. A. Carrington has also rendered loyal and efficient service to the Association and the Committee express their grateful thanks for her assistance.

14. Finance.—The Accounts for the year ended the 30th June, 1937, revealed a surplus of £101 15s. 8d. A sum of £30 9s. 4d. was transferred to the World Championship (1935) Loan Account.

A Receipts and Payments account for the period ended 25th April, 1938, will be submitted at the Annual General Meeting.

17. LEGAL STATUS.—Consideration has been given to the Legal Status of the Association and the Committee have appointed a sub-committee consisting of Messrs. Montagu, Pope, Rose and Vint to investigate the matter.

18. Official Shirt.—After very careful enquiry the Committee approved a shirt for men and women manufactured by Messrs. Humphreys Bros. Ltd., of Manchester. An official clothing tab is placed on each shirt indicating the Association's approval and in recognition of this arrangement a rebate of 10% on all sales is made to the Association.

19. Physical Fitness.—In connection with the Government's Physical Fitness campaign the Committee have offered to co-operate with the National Advisory Committee for Physical Fitness and they have also affiliated to the Central Council for Recreative Physical Training.

# RESURFACING TABLE TENNIS TABLES BY J. M. JAQUES.

After some years of activity T.T. Secretaries are often faced with a minor problem in regard to the Club Table. If, as most Clubs are now doing, a good table was originally purchased, the problem is how to recondition it, rather than the purchase of a new table, but in the case of clubs who originally tried to save money by purchasing a "cheap" table, the only real solution to their problem is to buy a really good one, manufactured by a firm with a reputation to

Most good tables can be reconditioned, and provided the playing surfaces or the under-carriages are not too badly knocked about, this is worth doing, the change varying from £2 to £3 according to the work involved.

Club Secretaries possessing amateur painters among their members want to be very chary of accepting offers of assistance. The suggestion, "You get the paint and we'll put it on ourselves," sounds very attractive, and helpful, but the result will probably not meet with the same degree of satisfaction from the more enthusiastic playing members of the Club.

All modern surfaces of T.T. Tables are attained through the application of many coats of cellulose paint, "fillers," "bodiers," "matters," etc., all spread over the wood surface by means of compressed air spray guns, so that the paint almost "drifts" on to the table. It is quite impossible to obtain the same result with ordinary brush work, as cellulose paint dries almost as soon as it is put on the table and there is no time to "work" it as with ordinary oil paint.

I strongly recommend those clubs who are within easy access of London to arrange for their tables to be returned to one of the manufacturers who make a speciality of resurfacing tables, so that they are assured of a satisfactory result.

With Provincial clubs the position is more difficult as the amount of rail carriage incurred in returning the table to London makes the cost prohibitive. In these cases, the Secretary would be well advised to get in touch with coach builders, shop fitters or other firms who are likely to have a cellulose spray plant available. Approached in the right way no doubt a firm could be found who would be willing to undertake the work. Although the result will probably not be as good as if the table had been returned to the manufacturers, it certainly should be considerably better than it was, and be fit for a few more seasons.

When a table is returned to the makers the surface is entirely scraped down to the white wood, which is then treated exactly as a new table, thus naturally producing a much finer surface than by just rubbing down with sandpaper, but scraping is a highly technical job, which I do not recommend anyone to tackle unless they have really expert knowledge.

# SUGGESTIONS FOR CLUB ACTIVITIES BY LESLIE BENNETT.

1. Club Ladders.—The game of table tennis would certainly benefit considerably if club-ladders were to be introduced into more clubs than before, for the competition created makes members very keen to improve their play. Below are some hints for the guidance of those officials who may be instituting such a competition at their club.

Entrance fees need not be charged and the club secretary can be made the official responsible for the administration and settlement of any queries. The names of the entrants are written out on cards which are pinned, hooked or slotted in order down a long board, with the weakest competitor at the top and the strongest at the foot. If the ladies play with the men, then they should start on top but it may be found better to have separate ladders.

Any competitor may be challenged for his or her place by either of the two immediately below. The challenge cannot be declined without a valid excuse and must be played at the first opportunity, umpire optional. The rubber should be to the best of three or five rubbers, though where time restricts it to two games, the challenger must win both to supplant the other. A player may issue not more than one challenge at a time nor having accepted a challenge, take on another before the first match is decided. If two challenges are made at the same time against the same member, that of the person senior on the ladder will be the only one acceptable.

When a challenge rubber has been completed, the name of the winner will be placed above that of the loser. If the challenger has issued a challenge to a player two places above and won, then the two names will be interchanged, and the name of the member in between them will remain untouched. A loser can be restricted from challenging again that day or that week or he may be allowed a maximum of two or three per day. Permanent individual handicaps can be fixed or the person take an automatic handicap according to the position on the ladder he or she occupies.

It should always be borne in mind that the scheme of a club-ladder is a means of intensifying practice and particularly of cultivating the stern will to win. It is not the best meanum for practising particular strokes nor should any ladder matches be given precedence over league matches or normal events; they should be fitted in without much trouble.

2. AMERICAN TOURNAMENTS.—Another method of providing more interest during club practice time is to provide American Tournament charts, separately for the ladies and the men. Each player meets each other player in the competition once or twice in a rubber the best of three or five games and the result is passed on to the responsible official generally the club secretary. From time to time he pins up on the notice board the relative positions of the contestants according to their results and when all matches have been played off in due course, the competition is completed.

Entrance fees can be charged and the stronger players can be handicapped. The league can be spread over the season or twice over the season. These American Tournaments are of special value to new comers to the game, who can gauge their progress by comparison with previous results.

4. How to Conduct Knock-out Draws.—Where in a knock-out tournament the number of entries is a Power of Two (4, 8, 16, 32 or 64) there are no byes and players meet in pairs. Otherwise there are byes in the first round only, which are distributed as follows:- It among a prohibated also

This scheme can be carried on in a like manner for a larger number.

EXAMPLE: -With 5, 13, 29 or 61 players entered there shall be 1 bye at the top of the draw; then the names are drawn and 2 byes at the bottom. With 23 or 55 entries there are 4 byes at top then the players are drawn and this leaves 5 byes at the bottom and so on as above, or in a like manner for larger numbers.

5. Club Championships.—A useful attraction for the club at the end of the season is the provision of a set of championships on a knock-out basis open only to members of the particular club, with entry fees again optional. These can comprise Wemen's Singles, Men's Singles, Junior Singles, Women's Doubles, Men's Doubles and Mixed Doubles, and each should carry the title of club champion. Preliminaries can be played off as and when required and the finals on one night.

6. ORDER OF PRACTICE PLAY.—While individual clubs will formulate appropriate rules for order of practice play, an occasional night or part of night can be devoted to the system of the winner's having the right to remain on the table to play the next comer. In this way temperament can be improved, unstable shots discovered, tactics made better and the determination to win and not to throw away points strengthened.

In Vienna, Wales returned and Belgium was represented for the first time, at the seventh Congress (February, 1933). Lithuania was absent. Poland was elected (18 members).

The eighth Congress was held in Paris (December, 1933). Wales was absent, Roumania resumed, and not only Switzerland and Poland were present for the first time, but also the new members elected—Holland and the U.S. Table Tennis Association. Northern Ireland was raised from good standing to membership (21 members).

The ninth Congress was in London (February, 1935) All the nations in membership were represented, including Jersey—taken into good standing, except Japan, Roumania, Sweden, Canada—newly elected, and Egypt—re-elected (23 members).

At the tenth Congress in Prague (March, 1936), Roumania was represented again, but All-India, Irish Free State, Jersey, Northern Ireland, Switzerland, Wales were absent, in addition to Japan, Sweden, Canada and Egypt. Palestine was elected (24 members).

At the eleventh Congress in Vienna (February, 1937), Egypt was present for the first time; Holland and Latvia of those represented the previous year were absent. Australia was elected and Scotland taken into good standing (25 members).

The twelfth Congress was in London (January, 1938). With the exceptions of All-India, Australia, Canada, Japan, Jersey, Northern Ireland, Palestine, Roumania and Sweden, all the nations in membership were present, including U.S.A., re-elected. Luxembourg and New Zealand, absent, were elected and also Ireland as the amalgamation of Northern Ireland and Irish Free State (26 members).

The thirteenth Congress is fixed for Egypt, 1939.

Under the Chairmanship of Mr. I. Montagu, the following members were represented: Austria, Belgium, Czechoslovakia, Egypt, England, France, Germany, Holland, Hungary, Ireland, Jugoslavia, Latvia, Lithuania, Poland, Switzerland, Wales and U.S.A., while individuals attending were Messrs. Pope, Corbillon, Wilmott and Rose.

Luxembourg and New Zealand were unanimously admitted as members. Complete agreement having been reached between England and U.S.A., England proposed the re-election of U.S.A., seconded by France, unanimously carried. The amalgamation of the Irish Free State and Northern Ireland Associations was ratified and the affiliation agreed of the new All-India T.T.A. in India, with London representation

The wording of the new Rules as set out in the Handbook was confirmed. Secretaries were instructed to write immediately to the Japan T.T.A., to urge the inclusion of Table Tennis in the Olympic Games. The alteration of the Laws in connection with Pushing, the lower net, and finger-spin, which had been adopted provisionally for season 1937-38, were adopted as permanent with the time limit rule to be compulsory for World Championships, International Matches, and International National Championships.

Due to suggestions by England and U.S.A., a Sub-Committee had been formed to report to Congress on the Constitution and this comprised Messrs. Corbillon (France), Steffenhagen (Germany) and Bassford (U.S.A.). In an analysis of the situation Mr. Corbillon defined the proposals as falling into four groups:—

(a) Those referring to penalties inflicted by Associations and overlapping jurisdictions.

(b) The defining of powers and duties of the President and Advisory Committee, Secretaries' duties, postal yotes, etc.

(c) Question of differential subscription, voting power and representation for associates, amount of subscription, etc.

(d) The question of rights of nomination of proxy representation.

The following decisions were eventually arrived at :-

(1) Appointment of Sub-Committee—Messrs. Steffenhagen, Corbillon, Bassford and Montagu were elected.

(2) This Sub-Committee have power to circulate proposals to all countries.

(3) The alterations to Constitution can be put into operation if approved by a majority of three-fourths of those voting within two months of circularisation.

(4) Otherwise, the suggestions to come up for consideration at the next Congress.

As England and U.S.A. considered the present method of deciding the World Championships as unfair to the remoter countries, it was agreed that this Sub-Committee should consider and report on the general future of the Championships.

Mr. Wilmott submitted his report on Equipment and was thanked for his work in connection with the Equipment Committee. Methods were approved for selecting balls for International Competitions. It was unanimously agreed that Net Posts should be lowered to match the lowered Net and that this alteration should be incorporated in the Rules. After close voting and a recount it was agreed that the wire sounder of edge balls on tables should be abandoned.

The following Officers and Committees were elected for season 1938-39:—

President: Hon. Ivor Montagu. English Language Secretary: Mr. W. J. Pope. French Language Secretary: Mr. M. Corbillon. German Language Secretary: Mr. F. Lobl.

RULES, SUB-COMMITTEE: Corbillon, Heydusek, Montagu, Degryse, Pick (Austria), Kittermaster (U.S.A.).

EQUIPMENT COMMITTEE: Messrs. Bassford, Corbillon, Heim (Germany), Heydusek, Montagu, Wilczek (Hungary), and Secretary, A. J. Wilmott, 17, Melrose Road, London, S.W. 19.

The Championships for 1938-39 were assigned to Egypt and after a ballot the options for 1939-40 were assigned, the first to Hungary, and the second to Germany. It was agreed that these options were conditional upon acceptance by the holding Association of whatever new regulations for the Championships that might be approved by the next

The Minutes of 1936-37 were approved.

#### Rules.

- 1. The County Championship shall be organised by a County Championship Committee comprising two representatives of each county association or other body accepted as representing a geographical county for the purpose of the Championship and the president, chairman, and secretary-treasurer.
- 2. The Committee shall meet annually in summer for the election of officers for the coming season and for the arrangement of fixtures and other business.
- 3. Each Association or other body on entering for the Championship shall deposit 5/- with the secretary-treasurer and at the annual meeting shall contribute to the funds of the Championship Committee (1) an amount equal to the past year's expenses divided by the number of counties participating; and (2) an amount equal to five per cent. of the net profits of its home county championship matches in the past season. No expenditure shall be incurred by the Committee in any year in excess of the total of the amounts deposited, without the sanction of the participants in the championship that season.
- 4. The Championship shall comprise one or more sections with three to five counties in each section. Each team shall play home and away matches with each other team in its own section in successive years, with a play-off at a neutral venue between joint winners of a different section.
- 5. Matches shall be played on the Friday or Saturday in the weeks fixed, at the option of the visiting team, or on such earlier day as may be mutually agreed with the consent in writing of the Secretary and on payment in advance of a fee of two shillings and sixpence, or five shillings in the case of late applications described in (present) Rule 19, matches may be arranged for a day subsequent to the week fixed.

- 6. The hours of play shall be such as the visiting team require, but shall commence not earlier than 2 p.m. on Saturday or 6 p.m. on any other day.
- 7. The Visiting Team shall notify the home team of the day and hours of play not less than 21 days before the match.
- 8. The Home Team shall notify the visiting team of the address at which play will take place within five days from receiving notice of the day of play from the visiting team.
- 9. Seven days before a match each county shall send the names of its players in order of playing strength, in the case of a play-off to the Secretary, and in the case of other matches to the opposing county. Substitution shall be allowed only for good reason given, which shall be determined in the case of play-offs or finals by the referee, and in other cases must be accepted for the purposes of play but may be the subject of a claim that the match be forfeited or of a complaint.
- 10. The Winning Team shall send complete results on the form provided, signed by both captains if they agree the results, to the Secretary within 48 hours after the match is played.
- 11. PLAY.—Teams shall consist of three players, each of whom shall play each member of the opposing team a rubber of the best of three games, the winning side being that which wins five or more rubbers.
- 12. Subject to any re-arrangement mutally agreed, the order of play (A, B, and C being the home team or in a final being determined by lot) shall be: A v. X, B v. Y, C v. Z, B v. X, A v. Z, C v. Y, B v. Z, C v. X, A v. Y.
- 13. Any rubber not commenced within ten minutes of the time fixed for the start of the match or of the end or forfeiture of the previous rubber owing to the absence of a player shall be forfeited to the opposing team, or if both players are absent to the visiting team.
- 14. Players shall be members of leagues affiliated to the county association represented or where there is no county association to a league or club within the county represented, and shall not have represented any other county in the same

- 15. The home team shall be responsible for ensuring that the conditions of play shall be those laid down as standard by the County Championship Committee in Rules 29–34.
- 16. Default.—Any failure to comply with these Rules or with those of the English Table Tennis Association shall not entitle the opposing county wilfully to refuse to play a match, but may be the ground of a complaint or, if the county is seriously prejudiced in its arrangements or in its play, of a claim that the match be forfeited. No complaint or claim with respect to the playing conditions shall be entertained unless a complaint was made to the home team captain before the commencement of the fourth rubber of the match.
- 17. CLAIMS.—A county, may, within 48 hours after the time fixed for the playing of a match, send the Secretary a Claim (see Rules 25–27) that the match shall be forfeited to it.
- 18. The Secretary shall immediately forward a copy of any Claim received to the opposing county.
- 19. The opposing county if it wishes to refute the Claim, shall send an Answer (see Rules 25–27) to the Hon. Secretary within 48 hours of receiving it.
- 20. The Secretary shall immediately send a copy of an Answer received to the claiming county, and copies of both Claim and Answer to the Referee (The Chairman of the English Table Tennis Association) with, if necessary, a short statement of the position.
  - 21. The decision of the Referee on a Claim shall be final.
- the Tuesday after the date on which a match is due to be played, the Secretary shall notify the two counties that the match will be forfeited by both unless either an application for an extension of time accompanied by a fee of five shillings or a claim or the result accompanied by a fee of two shillings and sixpence is received by him within three days. A claim received shall be treated as a claim under (present) Rule 17.

- 23. If no Answer is received within three days of the sending of a copy of a Claim to a county the Secretary shall notify the county that its match has been forfeited to the claiming county.
- 24. APPEAL.—A county may appeal against any forfeiture of a match under Rule 22 or 23. An appeal (see Rules 25–27) must be received by the Secretary within three days of the dispatch of the notice of forfeiture, and shall be treated as a Claim or Answer as the case may be.
- 25. FORM OF PROCEDURE.—Every Claim, Answer and Appeal shall be in triplicate, and must state the full grounds on which it is made, including any rule infringed, any game affected or claimed, and where necessary a proper reply to any alleged default.
- 26. No amendment of or addition to a Claim or Answer shall be allowed but a county receiving a copy of an Answer may inform the Secretary by return of post if any statement therein is incorrect.
- 27. Any Claim, Answer or Appeal which is not in the proper form or which is out of time shall be ignored.
- 28. Penalties.—Whatever its outcome, every claim forfeiture, and complaint, shall be made the subject of a full report at the next meeting of the Committee which shall have power in the case of any default described in Rule 16 non-arrival or undue lateness at a match, to impose on the delinquent county or player a fine not exceeding one pound and/or suspension from partcipation in the County Championship. Any county or player failing to pay a fine imposed within seven days shall be automatically suspended from participation in the Championship until the fine is paid. The County Championship Committee may award all or any part of any fine imposed to the opponents and/or the body staging the match.

#### Standard Playing Conditions.

29. PLAYING SPACE.—The playing space shall be not less than 28 feet by 13 feet for each table and the table shall be placed lengthways in the middle thereof. It shall be free from all obstructions, and in particular from moving spectators and from spectators sitting behind the players.

30. FLOOR.—The floor shall be firm and even and shall not be unduly slippery. The best floor surface is wood, smooth but not slippery.

31. LIGHTING.—The lighting shall be equal in respect of strength, equal distribution (especially back from the table) and absence of dazzle, to that provided by three fairly new 100 watt pearl electric lamps, drawn opposite the middle of the table, one over the net, one six feet on either side of it, at a height of 10 feet, reflected downwards and shaded.

There shall be no unshaded lights beyond the ends of or alongside the playing space likely to reflect on to the table or otherwise to unsight the players and no illuminated light background or object behind the players.

32. TABLE.—The table shall comply with Rule 1 of the Laws of Table Tennis, in particular in size, height, regularity, bounce, non-reflection, edge. It may now be of any material, provided it gives the standard bounce.

33. NET AND SUPPORTS.—The net and supports shall comply with Rules 2 of the Laws of Table Tennis. The net must extend six inches beyond each side of the playing surface.

34. BALL.—The ball shall be the "Villa Ball." Sufficient samples shall be available to enable a specimen satisfactory to both players to be selected for play.

35. CLOTHING.—Players are prohibited from wearing white or light coloured clothes that might, in the opinion of the duly appointed referee, tend to unsight an opponent, and must wear a sports shirt of single colour (except for a badge ot reasonable size) and rubber shoes. Men must wear grey flannel trousers or shorts, and women grey flannel skirts, trousers or shorts. All members of the same team shall wear similar clothing.

# THE LAWS OF TABLE TENNIS.

(As adopted by the International Table Tennis Federation.)

#### Singles.

1. The Table.—The table shall be in surface rectangular, 9ft. in length, 5ft. in width; it shall be supported in such a way that its upper surface shall be 2ft. 6ins. above the floor, and shall lie in a horizontal plane.

It shall be made of any material and shall yield a uniform bounce of not less than 8ins. and not more than 9ins, when a standard ball is dropped from a height of 12ins, above its surface.

The upper surface of the table shall be termed the "playing surface"; it shall be non-reflecting, of a dark colour with a white line  $\frac{3}{4}$ in. broad along each edge.

The lines at the 5ft. edges or ends of the playing surface shall be termed "end lines." The lines at the 9ft. edges or sides of the playing surface shall be termed "side lines."

- 2. The Net and its Supports.—The playing surface shall be divided into two courts of equal size by a net running parallel to the end lines and 4ft. 6ins. from each. The net shall be 6ft. in length; its upper part along its whole length shall be 6ins. above the playing surface; its lower part along the whole length shall be close to the playing surface. The net shall be attached at each end to an upright post 6ins. high; the outside limits of each post shall be 6ins. outside the side line on the same side.
- 3. The Ball.—The ball shall be spherical. It shall be made of celluloid, pale in colour; it shall not be less than 4½ ins. nor more than 4¾ ins. in circumference; it shall not be less than 37 grains (2.40 grammes) nor more than 39 grains (2.53 grammes) in weight.

- 4. The Racket.—The racket may be any material, size shape, or weight.
- 5. The Scoring of Points.—A game shall be won by the player who first wins 21 points, unless both players shall have scored 20 points, when the winner of the game shall be he who first wins two points more than his opponent.
- 6. The Choice of Ends and Service.—The choice of ends and the right to be server or striker-out in every match shall be decided by toss, provided that, if the winner of the toss chose the right to be server or striker-out, the other player shall have the choice of ends, and vice versa, and provided that the winner of the toss may, if he prefer it, require the other player to make the first choice.
- 7. The Change of Ends and Service.—After five points the striker-out shall become the server, and the server the striker-out, and so on after each five points until the end of the game or the score 20 all. At the score 20 all the striker-out shall become the server, and the server the striker-out, and so on after each point until the end of the game. The player who served first in a game shall be striker-out first in the immediately subsequent game, and so on until the end of a match.

The player who started at one end in a game shall start at the other in the immediately subsequent game, and so on until the end of the match. Where the match consists of only one game, or, where it consists of more than one game, in the deciding game of the match, the players shall change ends at the score 10.

8. Out of Order of Ends or Service.—If a player serve out of his turn, the player who ought to have served shall serve as soon as the mistake is discovered, unless a group of five

services shall have been completed before such discovery, when the service in the subsequent groups of services shall continue, in the same order, as if the sequence had not been discontinuous. In any circumstances, all points scored before the discovery shall be reckoned.

If the players shall not have changed ends when ends should have been changed, the players shall change ends as soon as the mistake is discovered, unless a game shall have been completed since the error, when the error shall be ignored. In any circumstances, all points scored before the discovery shall be reckoned.

- 9. The Order of Play.—The server shall first make a good service, the striker-out shall then make a good return and thereafter server and striker-out shall each alternately make a good return.
- 10. A Good Service.—The service shall be delivered by the server releasing the ball by hand only, without imparting of spin, into the air. The ball shall then be struck so that it touch first the server's court and then, passing directly over or round the net, touch the striker-out's court.

At the moment of the impact of the racket on the ball in service, both shall be behind the end line of the server's court and between an imaginary continuation of the side lines.

11. A Good Return.-A ball having been served or returned in play shall be struck by the player so that it pass directly over the net or round the net and touch directly the opponent's court; provided that, if the ball, having been served or returned in play, returns with its own impetus over the net or round the net, it may be struck, while still in play, by the player so that it touch directly the opponent's court.

12. A Let.—The rest is a let: It d' out - volve at let (a) If the ball served in passing over the net touch it or its supports, provided the service either be otherwise good or be volleyed by the striker-out. We true and henomot as

(b) If a service be delivered when the striker-out is not ready, provided, always, that he may not be deemed to be unready if he attempts to strike at the ball.

(c) If either player be prevented by an accident, not under his control, from serving a good service or making a good

(d) If either player lose the point, as provided in Law 13 (c), (d), (e), or Law 14, owing to an accident not within his

13. A Point.—Either player shall lose a point:

(a) If he fail to make a good service except as provided in

(b) If a good service or a good return having been made by his opponent, he fail to make a good return, except as provided in Law 12.

(c) If he, or his racket, or anything that he wears or carries, touch the net or its supports while the ball is in play.

(d) If he, or his racket, or anything that he wears or carries, move the playing surface while the ball is in play.

(e) If his free hand touch the playing surface while the ball is in play.

14. A Point.—Either player shall lose the point:

(a) If before the ball in play shall have passed over the end lines or side lines not yet having touched the playing surface on his side of the table since being struck by his opponent, it come in contact with him or anything that he wears or

(b) If at any time he volley the ball, except an provided in Law 12 (a).

- 15. In Play.—The ball is in play from the moment at which it is projected or dropped from the hand in service until:
  - (a) It has touched one court twice consecutively.
- (b) It has, except in service, touched each court alternately without having been struck by the racket intermediately.
- (c) It has been struck by either player more than once consecutively.
- (d) It has touched either player or anything that he wears or carries, except his racket or his racket hand below the
- (e) On the volley it come in contact with the racket or the racket hand below the wrist.
- (f) It has touched any object other than the net supports or those referred to above.
- 16. Further Definitions.—The period during which the ball is in play shall be termed a rest.

A rest the result of which is scored shall be termed a point. A rest the result of which is not scored shall be termed a let.

The player who first strikes the ball during a rest shall be termed the server.

The player who next strikes the ball during a rest shall be termed the striker-out.

If the ball, in passing over the net, or round the net, touch it or its supports, it shall, nevertheless, be considered to have passed directly, except as referred to in Law 12 (a).

If the ball in play come in contact with the racket or racket hand, not yet having touched the playing surface on one side of the net since last being struck on the other side, it shall be said to have been volleyed.

The racket hand is the hand carrying the racket; the free open hand is the hand not carrying the racket.

#### Doubles.

17.—The above laws shall apply in the Doubles Game except as below.

- 18. The Table.—The surface of the table shall be divided into two parts by a white line in. broad, running parallel with the side lines and distant from each of them 2ft. 53in. This line shall be termed the service-line. The part of the table surface on the nearer side of the net and the right of the service-line in respect to the server, shall be called the server's right half-court, that on the left in respect to him the server's left half-court. The part of the table surface on the farther side of the net, and the left of the service-line in respect to the server, shall be called the striker-out's right half-court, that on the right in respect to the server the striker-out's left half-court.
- 19. A Good Service.—The service shall be delivered as otherwise provided in Law 10, and so that it touch first the server's right half-court or the centre line on his side of the net, and then, passing directly over or round the net, touch the striker-out's right half-court or the centre line on his side of the net.
- 20. The Choice of Order of Play.—The pair who have the right to serve the first five services in any game shall decide which partner shall do so, and the opposing pair shall then decide similarly which shall first be striker-out.
- 21. The Order of Service.—The first five services shall be delivered by the selected partner of the pair who have the right to do so, and shall be received by the selected partner of the opposing pair. The second five services shall be

delivered by the striker-out of the first five services and received by the partner of the server of the first five services. The third five services shall be delivered by the partner of the server of the first five services and received by the partner of the striker-out of the first five services. The fourth five services shall be delivered by the partner of the striker-out of the first five services and received by the server of the first five services. The fifth five services shall be delivered as the first five services. And so on, in sequence, until the end of the game or the score 20 all, when the sequence of serving and striking-out shall be uninterrupted, but each player shall serve only one service in turn until the end of the game.

In a one game match, or the deciding game of the match of more than one game, the pair that served the first five services has the right to alter their order of striking out or that of their opponents at the score 10.

22. Out of Order of Striking-out.—If a player act as striker-out out of his turn, the player who ought to have acted as striker-out shall be striker-out as soon as the mistake is discovered, unless a group of five services shall have been completed before such discovery, when the order of striking-out shall continue in the subsequent groups of services as if the sequence had not been discontinuous. In any circumstances, all points scored before the discovery shall be reckoned.

23. The Order of Play.—The server shall first make a good service, the striker-out shall then make a good return, the partner of the server shall then make a good return, the partner of the striker-out shall then make a good return, the server shall then make a good return, and thereafter each player alternately in that sequence shall make a good return.

#### 24. Further Amendments and Additions:—

Law 6.—Alter "server," "striker-out," "winner," "he," to their respective plurals; alter "player" to "pair."

Law 7.—Delete first two sentences of first paragraph. In the third sentence, first paragraph, and in the second paragraph, alter "player" to "pair," "players" to "pairs," "striker-out" to "strikers-out."

Law 12 (b).—Insert "or his partner" after "striker-out"; "they" in place of the first "he"; "the striker-out" in place of the second "he."

Law 12 (c).—Insert "any" in place of "either."

Law 12 (d).—Insert "pair" in place of "player"; "their" in place of "his."

Law 13.—Insert "pair" in place of "player."

Law 13 (a).—Insert "the server" instead of "he."

Law 13 (b).—Insert "one of their opponents in proper sequence" in place of "his opponent"; "they" in place of "he."

Law 13 (c).—Insert "either partner" in place of the first "he."

Law 13 (d).—Insert "either partner" in place of the first "he."

Law 13 (e).—Insert "of either partner" after "hand" and "the" in place of "his."

Law 14.—Insert "pair" instead of "player."

Law 14 (a).—Insert "their" in place of the first "his"; "one of their opponents in proper sequence" instead of "his opponent"; "either partner" instead of "him."

Law 14 (b).—Insert "either partner" in place of "he.'

Law 15 (c).—Insert "any" in place of "either"; add "or by any player out of proper sequence, except as provided in Law 22."

Law 15 (d).—Insert "any" in place of "either."

Add as Law 15 (g).—"In service it has touched the server's left half-court or the striker-out's left half-court."

Decisions of the Rules Committee of the International Table Tennis Federation.

- 1. Edge Balls.—The phrase, "Table Surface" is to be interpreted as including the top edges and corners of the table-top, and a ball in play which strikes these latter is therefore good and still in play; though if it strikes evidently the side of the table-top below the edge, it becomes dead and counts against the last striker.
- 2. Ball Returned with Empty Hand.—If a player drop his racket, he cannot return the ball with empty hand. (See definition, "the racket hand is the hand carrying the racket.")
- 3. Racket Thrown at Ball.—If in returning the ball the racket leave the player's hand, it is a good return only if it were still in his hand at the moment of contact with the ball (see Law 11, "a ball . . . . shall be struck"), and if it do not touch the net or move the table surface (Law 13 c, d) before the ball is out of play.
- 4. Hand-spin in Service.—Any form of spin in service mparted by any agency but the racket is prohibited. The umpire shall, in any case of doubt, in the first instance in each match, warn the server, declaring a "let" and recommend him to serve with serving hand open and flat, fingers straight and together, thumb free. In any subsequent case of doubt, arising through failure of the server to do so, the umpire shall award the point to the striker-out.

- 5. Missed Service.—If a player in attempting to serve miss the ball altogether, it is a lost point (Laws 10 and 15) because the ball was in play from the moment it left the server's hand, and a good service has not been made of the ball already in play.
- 6. Volleyed Net Service.—A net service is a let not only if otherwise good but also if it be volleyed by the striker-out. (See Laws 12 (a) and 14 (b).)
- 7. Ball Fractured in Play.—If the ball split or become otherwise fractured in play, affecting a player's return, the rest is a let (Law 12 c). It is the umpire's duty to stop play, recording a let, when he has reason to believe that the ball in play is fractured or imperfect; and to decide those cases in which the faulty ball is clearly fractured in actually going out of play, and in no way handicaps the player's return, when the point should be scored. In all cases of doubt, however, he should declare a let.
- 8. Fixtures.—A moving spectator, a neighbouring player, a sudden noise, i.e., any neighbouring object in movement (except a partner) should be regarded as an accident not under control (Law 12 c), interference from which implies a let. A stationary spectator fixed seating, the umpire, the light, a nearby table, a continuous sound of even volume, i.e., any relatively constant or motionless hazard, should not be so regarded, and complaint against interference from it during play should be regarded as void.
  - 9. Estimated Times for Rubbers.
  - (a) Best of three games—minimum time 15 minutes; maximum time 20 minutes.
  - (b) Best of five games—30 minutes.
