RULES

NAME

- 1 The Association shall be called the English Table Tennis Association.
- 2 The Association shall be affiliated to the International Table Tennis Federation.

OBJECTS

- 3 The objects of the Association shall be as follows:—

- (a) To lay down and secure the adoption of uniform laws of the game of Table Tennis in England and to act as the legislative Authority.
- (b) To decide all doubtful or disputed questions as to the laws and all matters relating to the game in England.
- (c) To act as the sole controlling and governing body and generally to promote and encourage the playing, development and organisation of the game of Table Tennis in England.
- (d) To apply solely to the promotion of the foregoing objects all income and property of the Association from whatever source derived.

DEFINITIONS

- 4 (a) The following words and phrases shall throughout the Rules and Regulations of the Association have the meaning assigned to them by this Rule.
 - (1) affiliated club: a club in membership of a Local League.
 - (2) affiliated player: any player who is either a Directly Affiliated Individual or in membership of an affiliated body.
 - (3) Directly Affiliated Club: a club which pays an affiliation fee direct to the E.T.T.A., whether or not also in membership of a Local League.
 - (4) Directly Affiliated Individual: an individual who pays an affiliation fee direct to the E.T.T.A. whether or not also a member of a Directly Affiliated Club or of a club in membership of a Local League.
 - (5) Directly Affiliated School Club: a School Club which is accepted into direct affiliation with the E.T.T.A. whether or not also in membership of a league.
 - (6) division: a unit of a league which contains a number of teams.
 - (6a) General Secretary: For the purposes of these Rules this shall include any person designated by the National Council to fulfil the functions of General Secretary.
 - (7) Local League: any organisation or association which runs a competition between teams from clubs in a particular locality. Except where specifically excluded Local League includes Youth League.
 - (8) Member: any person mentioned in Rule 5(a), or any official, player or other member of a body mentioned in Rule 5(a), or of a club in membership of or affiliated to such a body.

- (9) **Organisation in Good Standing:** An organisation which has been given official recognition by the E.T.T.A. under Rule 5(b), being EITHER an organisation which is not a Table Tennis organisation, but under whose auspices Table Tennis is played, OR a Table Tennis organisation or competition which is not of a type mentioned in Rule 5(a).
- (10) **Permit Member:** a member of the Association duly registered under the provisions of Rule 37 and the Permit Members Regulations in Appendix "A."
- (11) **School Club:** a club the membership of which is restricted to schoolchildren.
- (12) **Schools League:** a league consisting entirely of School Clubs.
- (13) **Season:** The period commencing the day after completion of an Annual General Meeting and ending on the day when the next Annual General Meeting is completed.
- (14) **Youth Club:** a club which is certified by a local Education Authority Youth Committee to be a youth club or accepted by the National Council as a youth club.
- (15) **Youth League:** a league the membership of which is restricted to persons under 21 years of age and consisting entirely of Youth Clubs or of Youth Clubs and School Clubs.
- (b) (i) Where the context so permits the masculine gender shall be taken to include the feminine.
- (2) Where the context so permits the singular shall include the plural and vice versa.

CONSTITUTION

- 5 (a) The Association shall consist of:—
 - (i) President, Vice-Presidents, Honorary Life Members and duly elected Officers.
 - (ii) County Associations.
 - (iii) Affiliated Local Leagues, Directly Affiliated Clubs and Directly Affiliated Individuals.
 - (iv) Affiliated Schools Leagues and Directly Affiliated School Clubs.
- (b) Other organisations may be accepted into Good Standing at the discretion of the National Council.

AFFILIATION

- 6 (a) The normal unit of affiliation shall be the Local League. Any league playing under the Laws of Table Tennis as approved by the Association shall be eligible for affiliation.
- (b) Additionally any club, or any individual playing under the Laws of Table Tennis as approved by the Association shall be eligible for direct affiliation.
- 7 (a) Every applicant for affiliation to the Association shall complete the current affiliation form and shall sign it on behalf of himself or of the league or club for which application is being made.

- (b) (i) Such form shall then be submitted to the appropriate County Association (if any) which shall indicate whether the application is approved or not.
- (ii) If approval of the application be not given or refused by the County Association within 28 days it shall be deemed to be refused.
- (iii) If approval of the application be refused or deemed refused the applicant may apply to the National Council for the approval of the County Association to be dispensed with. If such an application to the National Council be refused the applicant may appeal to the Board of Appeal.
- (iv) In the event of any application or appeal as mentioned in Rule 7(b) (iii) the County Association concerned shall provide a written statement of its reasons for not approving the application. If such statement is not provided the application or appeal shall forthwith be granted or allowed.
- (c) (i) Every application for affiliation approved by a County Association (if appropriate), or for which such approval shall have been dispensed with, shall be granted or refused by the Management Committee which shall have the power to refuse without giving reasons.
- (ii) An applicant may appeal to the National Council against refusal by the Management Committee. For the purpose of this rule refusal shall be deemed if the Management Committee has not accepted or refused within 28 days of the application being made or, if a County Association's consent be necessary, within 28 days of such consent being given or dispensed with.
- (d) The procedure laid down by Rules 7(a) to (c) shall, unless resolved otherwise by the National Council, apply only to a first application for affiliation; renewal of affiliation shall be effected by sending the appropriate form direct to the E.T.T.A. General Secretary, and payment of the appropriate Affiliation Fees in due course.

AFFILIATION FEES

- 8 A Local League shall pay affiliation fees on the basis of the number of teams it has in membership and the number of players required to make up a team in that league.
- 9 (a) The annual Affiliation Fees shall be as follows:—
 - Local Leagues:
 - (i) 2/6d. per team place for each team in a league other than a Youth League (i.e. 5/- for each team playing in a 2-a-side division, 7/6d. for each team playing in a 3-a-side division and so on pro rata) except as provided in Rule 9(a) (iii).
 - (ii) 1/3d. per team place for each team in a Youth League.

(iii) 1-3d. per team place for each Youth Club team which plays in a Local League division membership of which division is restricted to persons under 21 years of age.

(iv) For each club not participating in the league competition a fee calculated as follows: The fee laid down by Rule 9(a) (i) multiplied by the lowest number of players required by the rules of that league to constitute a full team.

(v) Any Local League not affiliated to a County Association shall pay an additional fee of 3d. per team place as provided in Rule 32(a) (viii).

Calculation—The number of team-places in a league shall be calculated by adding together the number of team-places in each division of that league; the number of team-places in a division shall be calculated by multiplying the number of teams in the division by the lowest number of players required by the rules to constitute a full team.

(b) Directly Affiliated Clubs:—

(i) £1 10s. 0d. for each club affiliating directly, which is not a Youth Club.

(ii) 10s. for each Youth Club affiliating directly.

(c) Directly Affiliated Individuals £1 10s. 0d.

(d) Schools Leagues and Directly Affiliated School Clubs shall be affiliated without fee.

(e) Other organisations accepted into Good Standing under Rule 5(b) may be required by the National Council to pay such fees as the National Council may determine.

10 All Affiliation Fees shall be paid to the General Secretary of the Association not later than 15th November each season.

UNPAID AFFILIATION FEES

11 No Local League from or in respect of which any Affiliation Fees are due but unpaid shall be entitled to participate in any election of Officers or Councillors, nor to exercise any votes at a General Meeting, nor shall a County Association be entitled to exercise any votes in respect of such Local League, nor shall any member of such Local League be entitled to attend any General Meeting or take any part in the business of the Association.

HANDBOOK

12 Copies of the Association's current Handbook when published shall be supplied free of charge to every County Association, Local League, Directly Affiliated Club, Directly Affiliated Individual and Permit Member.

PRESIDENT AND VICE-PRESIDENTS

13 (a) The Association shall have a President and not more than 25 Vice-Presidents who shall be elected by the Annual General Meeting.

(b) The President or a Vice-President shall be elected for a term of three years, but shall be eligible for re-election at the end of such term.

(c) Nominations for President and Vice-Presidents shall be submitted only by the National Council.

(d) The President and Vice-Presidents shall hold office from the day following the A.G.M. at which they are elected.

(e) The President shall have the right to attend all meetings of the Association including meetings of the National Council and of the Management Committee.

HONORARY LIFE VICE-PRESIDENT

14 (a) The Association may elect a Life Vice-President, but only past Presidents of the Association shall be eligible.

(b) The distinction shall be conferred only at an Annual General Meeting.

(c) Candidates shall be nominated only by the National Council.

(d) The distinction shall carry with it the right to attend all General Meetings of the Association and the right to the Official Pass.

HONORARY LIFE MEMBERS

15 (a) The distinction of Honorary Life Member may be conferred for special or long service in connection with the game nationally.

(b) The distinction shall be conferred only at an Annual General Meeting.

(c) Candidates shall be nominated only by the National Council.

(d) The distinction shall carry with it the right to attend all General Meetings of the Association and the right to the Official Pass.

OFFICERS

16 (a) The honorary Officers of the Association shall be Chairman, Deputy Chairman, General Secretary (if the post be not suspended in the manner mentioned in Rule 16(e)) and Treasurer.

(b) All Officers shall retire annually at the end of the Annual General Meeting, but shall be eligible for re-election.

(c) A casual vacancy in an office shall be filled in the manner set out in Rule 17 so far as applicable, the nomination forms being sent out not later than seven days after the vacancy occurs.

(d) Notice of intention not to seek re-election to any Office should be sent to reach the General Secretary not later than January 31st in any year.

(e) Should the National Council under the provisions of Rule 19 appoint a paid General Secretary, the office of honorary General Secretary shall be suspended whilst such appointment is in effect.

ELECTION OF OFFICERS

17 (a) A nomination paper shall be sent by the General Secretary to the Secretary of every County Association and of every Local League (except as mentioned in Rule 11) not later than 16th April.

- (b) Each County or Local League shall be entitled to nominate one person for each office to be filled.
- (c) To be valid a nomination paper must:—
 - (i) be signed by the Secretary and by another responsible officer of such County Association or Local League, and
 - (ii) be received by the General Secretary of the Association (or such other person as may be appointed for the purpose by the Management Committee) not later than 14 days after the issue of the nomination papers.
- (d) No person will be effectively nominated unless he is named in at least two valid nomination papers.
- (e) Voting for the election of the Officers of the Association shall be by postal ballot (if there be more than one effective nomination for any office) which shall be conducted in such manner as the National Council may from time to time determine.
- (f) The vote of each County shall count as 1 unit, the vote of each Local League with 30 or less teams in membership 1 unit, 31—100 teams in membership 2 units and 101 or more teams in membership 3 units.
- (g) Every voting paper shall be signed by the Secretary and another responsible Officer of the organisation voting.
- (h) Scrutinisers shall be appointed by the National Council to determine any questions as to the validity of nomination and voting papers, and ascertain the result of any postal vote held under the provisions of this rule.
- (i) The result of the election of Officers shall be circulated concurrently with the nomination papers for the election of National Councillors under Rule 21(a).

OFFICIALS

- 18 The National Council shall at its discretion have authority to elect additional honorary officials for up to one year and to invite such persons to attend meetings of the National Council, but, unless they already be members of the Council, without right to speak (unless invited to do so) and without vote.

PAID APPOINTMENTS

- 19 (a) The National Council shall have power to create and fill any paid appointment which in its opinion is necessary.
- (b) The National Council shall approve any contract necessary in connection with such paid appointment and shall authorise the Officers to sign it on behalf of the Association. The contract shall thereupon be binding upon the Association.

NATIONAL COUNCIL

- 20 (a) The Association shall, subject to the control of the Annual General Meeting, be governed by a National Council which shall consist of the Officers of the Association (as defined by Rule 16(a)) together with one person representing each County Association elected annually in the manner laid down by Rule 21.

- (b) No Councillor may represent more than one County.
- (c) Every Councillor shall retire annually at the end of the Annual General Meeting but shall be eligible for re-election.
- (d) In the event of a Council seat becoming vacant, it shall be filled by election in the manner laid down by Rule 21 so far as applicable.
- (e) The quorum necessary for the transaction of business by the Council shall be fifteen members with the right to vote.
- (f) All past Chairmen of the Association shall be entitled to attend meetings of the Council with the right to speak but not to vote.
- (g) Except as herein otherwise provided, every question at a meeting of the Council shall be determined by a majority of the votes of the members present and voting, every member having one vote, and in the case of an equality of votes the chairman of the meeting shall have a second or casting vote. The President and past Chairmen shall not be entitled to vote.
- (h) The Council may delegate any of its duties and powers to the Management Committee or any Sub-Committee.
- (i) Standing Orders for the Management Committee shall be subject to approval by the Council.
- (j) The Council may appoint sub-committees consisting of such person as it thinks fit, which shall, in the performance of their duties, conform to any regulations that may be imposed on them by the Council and shall report to the Management Committee.
- (k) The administration of the Rules and Regulations of the Association shall be vested in the Council who shall (subject to Rule 20 (h)):
 - (i) Decide questions of laws and other matters relating to the game but cannot alter the Rules of the Association.
 - (ii) Decide matters relating to International and representative matches, teams, conferences, etc., as affecting the Association.
 - (iii) Sanction Open Tournaments, Invitation Tournaments or general Competitions.
 - (iv) Decide all questions under Rule 47.
- (l) The Council shall have the power to make regulations to cover international contacts, regulation dress and badges and such other matters not specifically dealt with in these Rules as the Council shall think fit. Such regulations shall be published as appendices to these Rules.
- (m) At the first meeting of the Council after the Annual General Meeting it shall agree its Standing Orders for the coming period of office.
- (n) The Council shall hold a meeting within fifteen days after the Annual General Meeting, at which meeting Management Committee members shall be elected as provided by Rule 23.
- (o) The Council shall hold a minimum of three meetings every season.

ELECTION OF NATIONAL COUNCIL

- 21 (a) A nomination paper shall be sent by the General Secretary to the Secretary of every Local League which is affiliated to a County Association (except as mentioned in Rule 11) not later than 16th May.

- (b) Each Local League shall be entitled to nominate a person to be National Councillor for the County Association of which such Local League is in membership.
- (c) To be valid a nomination paper must:—
 - (i) be signed on behalf of the Local League or County Association by the Secretary and another responsible officer thereof, and
 - (ii) be received by the General Secretary of the Association (or such other person as may be appointed for the purpose by the Management Committee) not later than 14 days after issue of the nomination papers.
- (d) No person will be effectively nominated unless he is named in at least two valid nomination papers. Exceptionally, where there is only one Local League in membership with the County Association, one valid nomination shall suffice.
- (e) In the event of there being no effective nomination from any County by the date provided by Rule 21(c) (ii), the E.T.T.A. General Secretary shall by a date determined by the Council (which date shall not be later than 7th June) inform the Secretary of such County Association, which shall then be entitled to nominate a person to be its Councillor for the following season, such nomination being effective if received by the E.T.T.A. General Secretary in writing by a date determined by the Council (which date shall not be later than 13th June).
- (f) If there be more than one person effectively nominated to represent any County Association, there shall be a postal ballot of the Local Leagues in membership of that County Association carried out in such a manner as shall be determined by the National Council.
- (g) The vote of each Local League having 30 or less teams in the League shall count as one unit, each Local League having 31 to 100 teams as two units, and each Local League having more than 100 teams three units.
- (h) Each Local League's voting paper shall be signed by the Secretary and by another responsible officer of such League.
- (i) Scrutineers shall be appointed by the National Council to determine any questions as to the validity of nomination and voting papers, and to ascertain the result of any postal vote held under the provisions of this Rule.
- (j) A list of the National Councillors elected shall be circulated not later than 17th June.

MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

- 22 (a) There shall be a Management Committee to manage the affairs of the Association in accordance with the policy and directions of the National Council.
- (b) Such Committee shall consist of the Officers and four other National Council members elected by the National Council in the manner laid down by Rule 23.
- (c) Committee members (other than the Officers) shall retire on the election of their successors at the first Council meeting after the Annual General Meeting. Committee members shall be eligible for re-election.

- (d) Any casual vacancy occurring in the Committee shall be filled in the manner laid down by Rule 23 as far as applicable.
- (e) The quorum necessary for the transaction of business by the Committee shall be four, including at least one Officer.
- (f) All past Chairmen of the Association shall be entitled to attend meetings of the Committee with the right to speak but not to vote.
- (g) Except as herein otherwise provided, every question at a meeting of the Committee shall be determined by a majority of the votes of members present and voting, every member having one vote, and in the case of an equality of votes the chairman of the meeting shall have a second or casting vote. The President and past Chairmen shall not be entitled to vote.
- (h) The Standing Orders for the Management Committees shall be as approved by the National Council under Rule 20(i).

ELECTION OF MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

- 23 (a) The four members of the Management Committee other than the Officers shall be elected by secret ballot of the National Council.
- (b) The ballot shall be held at the first meeting of the National Council after the Annual General Meeting (hereinafter referred to as "the Election Meeting").
- (c) A nomination paper shall be given to every member of the Council present.
- (d) Each member shall be entitled to nominate up to four persons.
- (e) No person will be effectively nominated unless he is named in at least two papers.
- (f) Each member of the National Council shall vote for four persons, no more, no less.
- (g) The four persons receiving the highest number of votes shall be declared elected. If an equality of votes results in there not being four persons with a clear majority over the other candidates, then those who have such clear majority shall be declared elected, and a fresh ballot shall be held for the remaining seat or seats, for which only candidates unsuccessful in the previous ballot shall be eligible.
- (h) Scrutineers shall be appointed by the Annual General Meeting to determine any question as to the validity of nomination and voting papers and ascertain the result of the ballot.

FINANCE

- 24 The financial year of the Association shall end on 31st May, and an audited statement of accounts up to and including this date shall be published annually.
- 25 The Auditors shall be elected by the Annual General Meeting and shall take office from the day following that meeting.
- 26 The funds of the Association shall be lodged at a bank, and all cheques, drafts, etc., drawn on the account shall be signed by the Treasurer and by either the Chairman or General Secretary.

55

- 27 If at any time the National Council shall procure the registration under the Companies Act, 1948, of a company limited by guarantee having amongst its objects, objects similar to those of the Association, the National Council shall have the power to transfer and pay over to such company without consideration the whole of the property and assets of the Association (after payment of or provision for the liabilities of the Association) and after such transfer and payment over to declare by resolution that the Association is dissolved. Any such transfer and payment shall be valid and binding upon all parties interested and such declaration shall be effective.
- 28 If upon the winding up or dissolution of the Association there remains, after the satisfaction of all its debts and liabilities, any property whatsoever, the same shall not be paid to or distributed among the members of the Association, but shall be given or transferred to some other institution or institutions having objects similar to the objects of the Association and if effect cannot be given to such provision then to some other purposes approved by the Commissioners of Customs and Excise.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

- 29 (a) The Annual General Meeting of the Association shall be held in the last week in June or the first week in July.
- (b) Notice specifying the place, the date and hour together with the Agenda, shall be given to the Secretary of every County Association, Local League and Directly Affiliated Club and to every Directly Affiliated Individual not later than 1st June.
- (c) Attendance at the A.G.M. shall be open to all Members (except as mentioned in Rule 11).
- (d) Each County Association, and each Local League which has exercised the option under Rule 30(a), shall be entitled to appoint an Accredited Representative who shall hold the official Voting Card issued by the E.T.T.A. signed by the Secretary of his County Association or Local League.
- (e) The Agenda for the Annual General Meeting shall include the following items:—
- (i) To adopt Standing Orders for the meeting.
 - (ii) To read the minutes of the previous Annual General Meeting.
 - (iii) To consider any matters arising therefrom.
 - (iv) To read the minutes of any Special General Meeting held since the previous Annual General Meeting.
 - (v) To consider any matters arising from (iv).
 - (vi) To receive and consider the Annual Report of the National Council.
 - (vii) To receive and consider the Report of the Treasurer, the Report of the Auditors and the Statement of Accounts made up to May 31st or a subsequent date.
 - (viii) To consider and determine any alterations to Rules.
 - (ix) To consider any other Motions.
 - (x) To elect the President and Vice-Presidents if appropriate.
 - (xi) To elect Honorary Life Members of the Association.
 - (xii) To elect Scrutineers for the next Management Committee election.

- (xiii) To elect Auditors for the ensuing year.
 - (xiv) To receive the Report of the Election of Officers.
 - (xv) To receive the Report of the Election of National Councillors.
 - (xvi) To consider any other competent business.
- (f) Before transacting any business the A.G.M. shall adopt Standing Orders which shall govern procedure at the meeting.
- (g) Motions affecting the constitution or the Rules of the Association or the Laws of Table Tennis as approved by the Association (i) may be proposed only by the National Council or by a County Association or a Local League and (ii) may be subject to Block Voting as provided in Rule 29(i).
- (h) On any motion the chairman shall have the power to test the meeting's feelings by a show of hands of Accredited Representatives. After declaring the hands shown for and against the motion the chairman shall declare the motion carried or lost, except as provided in Rule 29(i).
- (i) On a motion as specified in Rule 29(g) the chairman shall accept a demand for a Block Vote from any Accredited Representative, or may himself decide to proceed to a Block Vote. In the absence of a demand for a Block Vote, if the chairman is satisfied that the show of hands indicates a clear decision, he may dispense with a Block Vote and declare the decision on the basis of the hands shown.
- (j) Block Vote: In Block Voting each County Association's Accredited Representative shall exercise the votes of every Local League in his County except any Local League which has exercised the Option given by Rule 30(a), or any Local League as mentioned in Rule 11. The Accredited Representative of a Local League which has exercised the Option given by Rule 30(a) shall exercise the votes of his Local League. Each Local League shall be entitled to one vote for each team in membership.
- (k) A majority in excess of opposition of one-third of the votes cast shall be necessary to carry any resolution in respect of the Rules of the Association and the Laws of Table Tennis. Other resolutions shall be decided by simple majority, and, in the event of a tie, except on financial questions, the meeting shall proceed to the next business. In the matter of finance the chairman shall have a casting vote.

VOTING BY LOCAL LEAGUES AT GENERAL MEETINGS

- 30 (a) Any Local League wishing to exercise its own votes at a General Meeting shall give notice in writing to the General Secretary of the Association of its desire so to do not later than 14 days before the date of the General Meeting, such notice being signed by the Secretary and by another responsible officer of the Local League. The General Secretary shall issue an official Voting Card to the Secretary of such Local League not later than seven days before the date of the meeting.
- (b) The votes of every Local League which does not exercise the option granted by Rule 30(a) shall be exercised by the Accredited Representative of the County Association to which such Local League belongs.

SPECIAL GENERAL MEETING

- 31 (a) A Special General Meeting of the Association shall be convened on a resolution of the National Council, or within one month of receipt by the General Secretary of a request signed by the authorised representatives of at least one third of the Local Leagues.
- (b) Rule 29 respecting circulation of notices and procedure shall apply as for the Annual General Meeting so far as applicable, at least 28 days' notice being given.

COUNTY ADMINISTRATION

- 32 (a) (i) Where a majority of affiliated Local Leagues in any County agree, a body shall be set up for the purpose of administration in the County.
- (ii) The administrative area of a County Association shall be defined primarily by the geographical boundaries of the County in force for the time being.
- (iii) There shall be no County of London, but for the purpose of these Rules the Greater London area shall be divided as follows:—
The boroughs of Bexley, Bromley, Greenwich and Lewisham shall be part of Kent.
The boroughs of Barking, Havering, Newham, Redbridge and Waltham Forest shall be part of Essex.
The boroughs of Croydon, Kingston, Lambeth, Merton, Richmond-on-Thames, Southwark, Sutton and Wandsworth shall be part of Surrey.
The boroughs of Barnet, Brent, Camden, Chelsea, City, Ealing, Enfield, Hackney, Hammersmith, Harringay, Harrow, Hillingdon, Hounslow, Islington, Kensington, Tower Hamlets and Westminster shall constitute the County of Middlesex.
- (iv) A Local League shall affiliate to the County Association in whose geographical area the majority of its member clubs are situated, except as provided in (v) or (vi) below.
- (v) A Local League operating near or across the boundaries of two or more Counties may select to which of the County Associations concerned it shall affiliate, subject to the approval of those County Associations and of the National Council.
- (vi) A Local League continuously affiliated to a County Association other than that defined by Rule 32(a) (iv) since before 18th January, 1964, shall have the right to continue to affiliate to that Association.
- (vii) In any case where the National Council may decide that a Local League shall not be obliged to affiliate to a County Association, either (1) because no County Association exists in the County concerned or (2) because membership of the Local League concerned is spread over more than one County, an additional fee of 3d. per team place for each team in membership with the said Local League shall be paid to the E.T.T.A. Money so received in case (1) shall be passed to the appropriate County Association if one be formed during the year to which payment relates, but shall otherwise become ordinary E.T.T.A. income. Money so received in case (2) shall be divided

in such a manner as the National Council may decide among the County Associations in whose areas the Local League concerned operates.

- (b) (i) Membership of or affiliation to such County Association shall be compulsory for all Local Leagues, Directly Affiliated Clubs, Directly Affiliated Individuals, Schools Leagues and Directly Affiliated School Clubs in the County, except as provided under Rule 32(a).
- (ii) All organisations in the County in Good Standing with the E.T.T.A. shall be accepted into Good Standing by the County Association.
- (c) The Constitution and Regulations of each County Association and any amendments thereto shall not be valid unless approved by the National Council.
- (d) A County Association shall have power to organise Open and Invitation Tournaments (subject to the sanction of the National Council) Closed Tournaments, County Leagues, County Championships, Inter-League matches and Inter-County Championships. They shall also have power, in conjunction with other County Associations, to run representative matches, leagues, etc.
- (e) A County Association shall have complete autonomy in organising and administering the game in the county but shall have no power to alter the laws of the game or the rules and regulations of the Association or to over-ride the decisions of the National Council.
- (f) A County Association shall have power to suspend Local Leagues, Clubs, players or officials and such suspensions to be compulsorily carried out by all bodies in the county, subject to a right of appeal to the National Council. The suspension to be made national if so decided by the National Council.
- (g) A County Association shall be entitled to receive each season from the E.T.T.A.:—
(i) a rebate of 20% in respect of Affiliation Fees paid to the E.T.T.A. by 31st March by Local Leagues, Directly Affiliated Clubs and Directly Affiliated Individuals in membership with such County Association and
(ii) a rebate of 20% of the competitors' fees paid to the E.T.T.A. in respect of Tournaments played within the area of such County Association and
(iii) a rebate of 20% of the fees paid by 31st March by all Permit Members whose application forms were countersigned on behalf of such County Association.

COMPULSORY RULES

- 33 Every County Association shall include in its Rules the following:—
(i) The County's representative on the National Council shall, if not otherwise a member, be ex-officio a member of the County Committee.
- (ii) A Local League shall pay affiliation fees on the basis of the number of teams it has in membership and the number of players required to make up a team in that league.
- (iii) Schools Leagues and School Clubs may affiliate to the County Association without fee.

GENERAL AND DISCIPLINARY

- 34 No affiliated player or club may take part in competition with any player or club, or in exhibition at any club, or under any auspices, not registered or affiliated to the English Table Tennis Association, without the sanction of the County Secretary concerned.
- 35 No affiliated player may permit a cinematographic record of himself or herself to be taken in connection with Table Tennis for public exhibition unless sanction has first been obtained from the General Secretary of the Association.
- 36 No affiliated player, organiser or official may take part in a televised event in connection with table tennis unless sanction has first been obtained from the General Secretary of the Association or the event is one authorised by the Association.
- 37 Permit Members:—
- The National Council shall have power to make regulations governing the conduct of Permit Members which regulations shall be included in Appendix 'A' to these Rules.
 - No payment, other than expenses, shall be made to or received by any Member for playing, coaching, umpiring, writing, filming, broadcasting, televising, or for exhibitions or in relation to equipment, unless he has been duly registered as a Permit Member or has received specific permission from the National Council of the English Table Tennis Association to receive it. Application of this Rule may be excused at the discretion of the National Council in respect of writing, filming, broadcasting and televising.
- 38 No affiliated player shall be paid or receive any remuneration other than expenses (return fare, hotel accommodation and meals) or reward (other than prizes as provided for in the Association's regulations dealing with the Permit Member) for playing in any competitive table tennis event. A competitive table tennis event is one in which a player is playing for his Club, League, County or Country against another Club, League, County or Country, or in an Open, Closed, Invitation, or other Tournament, Trial or representative matches organised by Club, Leagues, Counties or the National Association shall rank as competitive play.
- 38(a) No Affiliated Organisation or Club shall make any payment, other than expenses, to a Member for any of the activities mentioned in Rule 37(b) unless the Member has been registered as a Permit Member or has received specific permission as above. Any affiliated Association or Club making a payment in excess of expenses must, if required by the Secretary of the E.T.T.A. or the County Secretary concerned, report the payment, specifying the amount and the services rendered, within fourteen days of such a request being received.
- 38(b) No affiliated player shall be paid or receive any reward or remuneration other than expenses (return fares, hotel accommodation, meals) for playing in a representative match or Open Tournament, except as in Rule 38(c). A representative match is one in which a player is playing for his club, league, county or country against any other team, league, county or country. Proper Trial Matches organised by clubs, leagues, counties or the National Association for the purpose of selecting representative teams shall rank as participation in Representative matches.

- 38(c) Prizes of £5 or less in value may be awarded or accepted without special permission other than the general sanction granted for the holding of Open Championships. No prize may exceed £5 in value. Badges and colours may be awarded and accepted for participation in representative matches.
- 39 (a) No affiliated player may enter into a contract in return for capitalising his skill at table tennis without the sanction of the National Council.
- No affiliated player may enter into a contract providing for his exclusive use of certain materials or exclusive play on certain premises controlled by a firm, in any circumstances.
- 40 Betting in any shape or form on players or matches is strictly prohibited.
- 41 A person gainfully connected with table tennis may occupy an administrative office, or serve on an administrative committee of the Association only provided that he is prepared to withdraw from any meeting or abstain from voting on any issue, on request formally passed by a majority of the meeting he is attending.
- 42 In all tournaments and matches sanctioned by the National Council, players are prohibited from wearing white or light coloured clothes that might, in the opinion of the duly appointed referee, tend to unsight an opponent.
- Recommendation adopted at A.G.M. April, 1952: All competitors are strongly recommended to wear a sports shirt or other top of single colour (except for badge, of reasonable size), trousers, skirts, or shorts of single colour and rubber shoes. All counties, leagues, local associations and clubs are requested to use their best endeavours to secure compliance with this recommendation. Players representing the Association in an International or other representative match must wear the regulation dress as instructed by the National Council.
- 43 Any player having accepted selection by the Association to attend any international match or other event and without good and sufficient cause either refusing to comply with the arrangements of the National Council or any of its sub-committees for playing the match or event, or failing to attend the same, may be adjudged by the National Council to have been guilty of misconduct, and any Member adjudged to have encouraged such player to commit a breach of instruction or rule shall be deemed guilty of a like offence.
- 44 No Member or affiliated organisation shall play Table Tennis with or against or take part in any Table Tennis function in conjunction with any suspended organisation or Member.
- 45 (a) In the event of any act, statement, writing, conduct or matter not provided for elsewhere, which, in the opinion of the National Council is likely to bring the game of Table Tennis into disrepute, the National Council may request the Member responsible for such act, statement, writing, conduct or matter (hereinafter called "the offender") to give a written undertaking not to repeat such act, statement, writing, conduct or matter, nor to do or commit any similar act, statement, writing, conduct or matter. In default of such undertaking being given within seven days from the sending of a written request to the offender, or if such undertaking is given and there is any breach thereof, then such default or breach shall be misconduct.

- (b) The National Council shall have the power to resolve that any such act, statement, writing, conduct or matter as is mentioned in Rule 45(a) is in itself misconduct and shall be dealt with as such.
 - (c) The National Council shall have the power to resolve that any breach of a Regulation of an Open Tournament duly approved by the E.T.T.A. shall constitute misconduct.
- 46 Failure of any Member without good and sufficient cause to attend the Hearing of any allegation or appeal after having been requested with reasonable notice so to do, or failure without good and sufficient cause to answer any question put to him in connection with such allegation or appeal shall be deemed misconduct.
- 47 Upon any breach of these Rules or of the Regulations made thereunder or of any misconduct as defined in these Rules being proved to the satisfaction of the National Council, the Council shall have power to order the Member or organisation guilty of such breach or misconduct (the offender).
- (i) To be suspended either indefinitely or for a stated period.
 - (ii) To be fined (either in addition to suspension or not).
 - (iii) To be censured.
 - (iv) To be dealt with in such other manner as the National Council may think fit.
- There shall be no appeal against such decision.
- 48 Any Member or organisation charged with any breach or misconduct shall be furnished with details in writing of such charge and shall have the right to a personal Hearing or to make written representations.
- 49 The procedure for dealing with any allegation of breach of Rule or Regulation or misconduct shall be determined by the National Council and shall be included in Appendix 'E' to these Rules.

APPEALS

- 50 Any individual or club aggrieved by a decision or action of a Local League, or a Committee or Officer of such League, may appeal against any such decision or action to the County Association to which such Local League is affiliated, or if there be no such County Association, to the National Council of the E.T.T.A., and the decision of the body to which the appeal is made shall be final and binding on all parties.
- 51 (a) Any individual, club or Local League aggrieved by a decision or action of a County Association, or a Committee or Officer of such Association, or of the E.T.T.A., or the National Council, or a Committee or Officer of the E.T.T.A., (except a decision under Rule 47) may appeal against any such decision or action to the Board of Appeal of the E.T.T.A.
- (b) The Board of Appeal shall consist of eight persons appointed by the National Council but not being members of the Council.
 - (c) The procedure for matters being dealt with by the Board of Appeal shall be determined by the Board and a copy of the Regulations governing such procedure shall be supplied to every organisation or Member against whom a breach of Rule or Regulation or misconduct is alleged, or any organisation or Member making any appeal under these Rules.

- (d) Each appeal shall be determined by three members of the Board of Appeal selected by the Management Committee, who shall also designate one of the three as Chairman.
 - (e) The Board shall decide the appeal, except that, where the appeal would be upheld on a technicality only, or due to a procedural irregularity by the body appealed against, then the Board may remit the matter to be dealt with afresh by the body appealed against, with a direction regarding the technicality or procedural irregularity.
 - (f) Where the appeal is against disciplinary action the Board shall have the power to vary the punishment imposed.
 - (g) The decision of the Board shall be final and binding on all parties.
 - (h) The decision of the Board shall be published forthwith, and a written minute of the decision shall be sent to the appellant and all other parties to the appeal.
- 52 Any such appeal (as provided for by Rules 50 and 51) shall be made in writing to the General Secretary of the appropriate body within 21 days of the decision or action appealed against, and shall be accompanied by a fee of 10/- in the case of an individual or £2 in the case of an organisation which shall be returned if the adjudicating body consider the making of an appeal to have been justified (whatever the result). Either party to the appeal shall be entitled to be heard by the adjudicating body, both in person, and, if so desired, additionally by a representative who shall have been nominated in writing when the appeal was lodged.
- 53 Whilst any appeal is pending the decision against which the appeal has been made shall not have effect.
- 54 The Rules of the Association being sufficient to enable the National Council, as the governing body of the game of Table Tennis in England, or the Board of Appeal to deal with all cases of dispute, legal proceedings shall be taken only as a last resort, after the full procedure laid down by these Rules and any Regulations made thereunder shall have been followed through.
- 55 The Association shall be entitled to publish in the public Press, or in any other manner it shall think fit, reports of its proceedings, acts and resolutions, whether the same shall or shall not, reflect upon the character or conduct of any league, club or Member, and every such league, club and Member shall be deemed to have assented to such publication.

OPEN AND INVITATION TOURNAMENTS

- 56 (a) The National Council shall have power to make regulations defining categories of tournaments, and governing the conduct and organisation of such tournaments as may be specified. Such regulations shall be included in Appendix 'B' to these Rules.
- (b) Every tournament shall come within one of the categories defined by the National Council in Appendix 'B', and the National Council shall have power to decide in which category any particular tournament shall be placed.
 - (c) No Open or Invitation Tournament shall be held without the sanction of the National Council. Application for running an Open or Invitation Tournament shall be submitted to the appropriate County Association (if any) who shall forward the application to the National Council with their recommendations.

ENGLISH OPEN CHAMPIONSHIPS

57 The English Open Championships may be held once every year and when so held:—

- (a) The date and venue shall be fixed and notice of same circulated as in Rule 29(b) not later than December 31st each year.
- (b) Twelve Championships shall be held as follows: Men's Singles, Men's Doubles, Women's Singles, Women's Doubles, Mixed Doubles, Junior Singles (Boys), Junior Singles (Girls), Junior Doubles (Boys), Junior Doubles (Girls), Junior Mixed Doubles and Women's Veterans' Singles, and in addition a Men's and Women's Consolation Singles event for competitors eliminated in the first two played rounds of the Singles Championships. A walkover but not a bye shall rank as a played round. It shall be in the power of the National Council to decide, in any year, to hold Junior Championships events separately from the Senior Championships.
- (c) All matches in the Championships shall be the best of five games, with the exception of the Junior Singles (Boys), Junior Singles (Girls), Junior Doubles (Boys), Junior Doubles (Girls), Junior Mixed Doubles, Veterans' and Consolation events, which shall be best of three games.
- (d) Such of the regulations in Part II of Appendix 'B' as are specified in Part IV of Appendix 'B' shall apply to the English Open Championships.

ENGLISH CLOSED CHAMPIONSHIPS

58 The English Closed Championships may be held once every year and when so held:—

- (a) Five Championships shall be held as follows: Men's Singles, Men's Doubles, Women's Singles, Women's Doubles and Mixed Doubles. In addition a Men's and Women's Consolation Singles shall be held for competitors eliminated in the first two played rounds of the Singles Championships. A walkover but not a bye shall rank as a played round.
- (b) All matches in the Championships shall be best of five games with the exception of the Men's and Women's Consolation Singles event, which shall be the best of three games.
- (c) Such of the regulations in Part II of Appendix 'B' as are specified in Part V of Appendix 'B' shall apply to the English Closed Championships.

ALTERATION OF RULES

- 59 (a) These Rules and the Laws of the Game, as approved by the Association, may be changed (whether by addition, alteration or deletion) only by decision of an Annual General Meeting or of a Special General Meeting convened for the purpose.
- (b) Proposals for such changes to be considered by the next Annual General Meeting shall be submitted in writing to reach the General Secretary not later than the last day in February. All proposals so received shall be circulated to all County Associations and Local

Leagues during March and amendments or alternative proposals dealing with the same substance shall be accepted for consideration by the Annual General Meeting if submitted in writing and received by the General Secretary not later than the last day in April.

- (c) Proposals for such changes to be considered by a Special General Meeting shall be submitted to the General Secretary in writing together with the demand for that Special General Meeting.
- (d) Unless resolved otherwise by the meeting, any alteration to a Rule dealing with Affiliation Fees or other revenue, or with the rebate paid to County Associations shall take effect on the first day of the season next but one after that in which was held the meeting at which it was passed.
- (e) Except as provided by Rule 59(d), any alteration to a Rule shall take effect on the first day of the season following that in which was held the meeting at which it was passed, unless resolved otherwise by such meeting.

MATTERS NOT COVERED BY RULES

- 60 In the event of any question or matter arising which is not provided for in the Rules, such question or matter shall be dealt with by the National Council whose decision shall be final.
- 61 (a) Any communication to be sent by the Association to any person or organisation shall be properly sent if addressed to such person or to the General Secretary of such organisation at his last known address.
- (b) A County Association, Local League or club shall on demand supply to the General Secretary or other Officer of the Association the last known address of any Member who is a member of such County Association, Local League or club.

NOTE—From 1968/69 onwards Rules 8 and 9(a) will be as follows, and not as before printed:—

- 8 A Local League shall pay affiliation fees on the basis of the number of teams it has in membership, and the number of players required to make up a team in that league and to provide one reserve player per team.
- 9 (a) The annual affiliation fees shall be as follows:—
Local Leagues:—
(i) 2/6d. per team place, plus 2/6d. for one reserve place, for each team in a league other than a Youth League (i.e. 7/6d. for each team playing in a 2-a-side division, 10/- for each team playing in a 3-a-side division and so on pro rata) except as provided in Rule 9(a) (iii).
- (ii) 1/3d. per team place, plus 1/3d. for one reserve place, for each team in a Youth League.
- (iii) 1/3d. per team place, plus 1/3d. for one reserve place, for each team which plays in a local League division, membership of which division is restricted to persons under 21 years of age.
- (iv) For each club not participating in the league competition, 2/6d. per playing member.
- (v) Any local League not affiliated to a County Association shall pay an additional fee of 3d. per team place, plus 3d. for one reserve place per team.

Calculation—The number of team places in a League shall be calculated by adding together the number of team places in each division of that league: the number of team places in a division shall be calculated by multiplying the number of teams in the division by the lowest number of players required by the rules to constitute a full team.

APPENDIX 'A' to RULES (under Rule 37(a)) **PERMIT MEMBERS' REGULATIONS**

1 Payment to Members

- (a) No payment, other than expenses, shall be made to or received by any Member for playing, coaching, umpiring, writing, filming, broadcasting, televising, or for exhibitions or in relation to equipment, unless he has been duly registered as a Permit Member or has received specific permission from the National Council.
- (b) No Member shall be entitled to receive remuneration in consideration of his skill at table tennis, knowledge of table tennis affairs, or status in the organisation or administration of table tennis unless he is duly registered as a Permit Member.
- (c) No Permit Member shall receive any reward or remuneration, other than expenses (return fares, hotel accommodation, meals) for taking part in competitive play, except as provided in (d) below. Trials matches organised by a club, league, County or the E.T.T.A. shall be deemed to come within the term "competitive play."
- (d) Prizes of £5 or less in value may be awarded and accepted, provided that not more than one prize is awarded to a player in respect of any one event. No prize may exceed £5 in value. Badges and colours may be awarded and accepted for participation in representative matches.
- (e) No Permit Member may receive payment, other than expenses, for umpiring.

2 Payment for use of name in connection with equipment

- (a) Registration as a Permit Member shall not entitle any Member to accept payment in respect of the use of his name in connection with any equipment or clothing unless such Member also holds an Equipment Royalty Licence.
- (b) The fee for an Equipment Royalty Licence shall be £2 per season in addition to any fee payable for registration as a Permit Member.
- (c) Any Permit Member requiring an Equipment Royalty Licence shall send his Permit to the General Secretary of the E.T.T.A. with the fee prescribed by Regulation 2(b).

3 Method of Registration

- (a) Application to be registered as a Permit Member shall be made on the prescribed form to the E.T.T.A. General Secretary, accompanied by the appropriate fee. Where the applicant is a member of a Local League, the form must be countersigned by the Secretary of such, and by the Secretary of the County Association with which such Local League is in membership. Where the applicant is not a member of a Local League, the form must be countersigned by the

Secretary of the County Association (if any) in whose area the applicant resides.

- (b) In the event of a refusal of signature by the appropriate Local League the County Association concerned may, if thought fit, send forward the application, dispensing with the League's approval. In the event of a refusal by both League and County, the applicant may appeal to the National Council of the E.T.T.A., who shall have power to dispense with approval of League and County. Any such appeal shall be accompanied by a fee of £1, which may be forfeited in the event of the appeal not being successful.
- (c) The fee for registration shall be £2 per season, payable with a first application and thereafter on the 1st September each season until the registration shall have been cancelled in accordance with these Regulations.
- (d) Applications for registration shall be reported to and dealt with by the National Council at their meeting next following the application, provided that in urgent cases the E.T.T.A. General Secretary shall have power to grant provisional registration, subject to review by the National Council at their meeting next following. Provisional registration may only be granted when appropriate League and County signatures have been obtained.

4 Termination of Registration

- (a) The National Council shall have power to withdraw any Member's Permit for breach of Rule or Regulation, or for misconduct.
- (b) A Member may have his registration cancelled only by giving at least one month's notice in writing terminating on 1st September. Until the appropriate notice has been given to cancel registration, a Permit Member shall be liable to pay the renewal fee to the E.T.T.A. on the 1st September each season.

5 Permit

- (a) Every Permit Member shall be issued with a Permit, which shall indicate up to what date registration fees have been paid, and shall contain a notice drawing attention to Regulation 4(b).
- (b) A Member must send in his Permit each time he pays his fee.
- (c) A Member shall return his Permit to the Association on 1st September following notice being given under Regulation 4(b).

6 Arrears of Fees

No fees shall be accepted as being in respect of any season when fees are outstanding from that Member in respect of any previous season.

7 Code for Permit Members

- (a) A Permit Member shall not enter into any contract for exclusive play under particular auspices or on particular premises, or for the exclusive use of particular equipment, that might prevent him from entering an Open Tournament or from accepting instructions from a duly appointed captain in a representative match.
- (b) Except with the permission of the E.T.T.A. General Secretary, he shall not enter into any contractual obligation, nor play in any clash-ing event, which prevents him from representing the E.T.T.A. if required to do so.

- (c) He shall not appear in any competition or exhibition, other than one organised by a duly affiliated County Association, League, Club or other body of the E.T.T.A., without the sanction of the Secretaries of the E.T.T.A. and the County Association concerned. This sanction may be granted for a single event or for a series; it shall be withheld only if the promoter of the event, the location of the proposed premises, the details and nature of the proposed exhibition or the fact of clashing with an event organised by a local affiliated body or with a co-ordinated County programme so as to be injurious to the latter, are such that the event is liable to be injurious to the best interests of table tennis.
- (d) (Rule 40). Betting in any shape or form on players or matches is strictly prohibited.

8 Copies of Regulations

A copy of these Regulations shall be supplied to every Permit Member.

NOTE—Players who play abroad under auspices affiliated to the International Table Tennis Federation are subject, as far as payment and other matters are concerned, to the regulations of the Association governing the country where they play. In addition to observing the Regulations of the English Table Tennis Association, with which players are urged to familiarise themselves, every player is advised to ascertain that his Table Tennis abroad conforms to the Regulations of the Governing Body of the Country concerned.

Further, every player is advised to ascertain that the auspices under which he plays are properly affiliated to, and acting in accordance with the decisions of, an Association in membership with the International Table Tennis Federation. Finally, every player is advised not to enter into any contract in this country which will oblige him to be a participant in infringement of the Regulations of the Governing Body of any nation in membership with the International Table Tennis Federation. Disregard of this warning may render a player liable to penalty of another Association, confirmed by the English Table Tennis Association at its request.

APPENDIX "E"

Regulations governing the procedure for dealing with allegations of breach of Rule or Regulation or of misconduct.

- 1 In the event of any breach of Rule or Regulation or of any misconduct being alleged against any Member or organisation, notice shall be given to such Member or organisation in accordance with Rule 48.
- 2 Not later than 14 days after the posting of such notice the Member or organisation so charged may send to the General Secretary of the Association an answer thereto, and/or a written application for a hearing in accordance with Rule 48.
- 3 The powers and duties of the National Council shall be exercised by a standing sub-committee called the Disciplinary Committee, consisting of 5 persons appointed by the Council at its first meeting after the Annual General Meeting to serve until their successors are appointed. Any member having an interest in the

matter under consideration may be required to withdraw. The decisions of the Disciplinary Committee shall be published forthwith in the name of the Council.

- 4 In default of an application for a Hearing within the prescribed time, the matter shall be adjudicated taking into consideration such written representations or other evidence as may be thought fit.
- 5 Upon receipt of an application for a Hearing, the Member or organisation charged shall be given at least 14 days' notice of the date, place and time of the Hearing.
- 6 Where the allegation is against an organisation, any communication shall be addressed to the General Secretary of such organisation or other the person officially designated by such organisation to receive on its behalf official communications from the E.T.T.A., who shall also attend any Hearing on behalf of the organisation, unless some other person in place of the General Secretary be nominated in writing by the organisation.
- 7 Failure of any person involved to attend the Hearing, or to answer any question, or to produce any necessary papers, shall not prevent the Committee from proceeding to a decision.
- 8 Any Member charged, or the representative (designated by Regulation 6) of any organisation charged, may be accompanied at a Hearing by one other person of his choice, who shall not be a witness, and shall not (unless the person charged is under the age of 21 years) have the right to speak, but shall be entitled to make such a record of the proceedings as he may think fit.
- 9 The Member or organisation charged shall have the right to give and call evidence in rebuttal of the charge and shall have the right to cross-examine any witnesses who give evidence in support of the charge.
- 10 On the completion of the evidence the Hearing shall be closed and the decision shall subsequently be communicated in writing by the General Secretary of the Association to the Member or organisation charged and any other Member or organisation concerned, and such decision shall be deemed to be a decision of the Association and binding on all Members and affiliated bodies.

AMENDMENTS TO REGULATIONS

Add new Regulation as follows:—

13A REFUSAL OF ENTRIES

No entry may be refused (except under Regulation 13) without written authority from the Secretary of the Tournaments Sub-Committee of the E.T.T.A. An Organiser wishing to obtain such authority shall apply to the said Secretary, stating reasons, not later

than 7 days before the date of the Tournament, and the said Secretary shall obtain the agreement of an E.T.T.A. Officer before giving or refusing authority. The Secretary of the Tournaments Sub-Committee shall report all such applications to the next available meeting of the National Council.

- 41 In Regulation 8 (a) add:—
14 A statement, if such be the case, that no expenses are paid to any competitor.
- 43 Add new Regulations as follows:—
14A EXPENSES TO PLAYERS
If the Tournament Committee decide that no expenses will be paid to any competitor, a statement to that effect must be included in the Entry Form in accordance with Regulation 8(a) 14.
- 40 in Part I, Definition 2, third line, insert "and 5 (a)" between "Regulations" and "15 (f)"
- 42 in Reg. 8 (c) insert "General" before "Secretary" in two places.
- 44 In Reg. 15 (f) delete "space" insert "area." In line 2 delete "39 feet" insert "46 feet," delete "19½ feet" insert "23 feet"
In Reg. 16 delete "Open"
In Reg. 17 delete "Open"
- 45 at the end of Part II insert new Regulation 20 as follows:—
No gambling is permitted, other than participation in lotteries conducted by permission of the Organising Committee. Any affiliated member taking part in gambling at a Tournament sanctioned by the E.T.T.A. is liable to immediate disqualification from the Tournament and eviction from the premises, and the matter reported to the E.T.T.A.
