





(as at 6th July, 1969, re-numbered 1st January, 1970)

NAME

- 1 The Association shall be called the English Table Tennis
- 2 The Association shall be affiliated to the International Table Tennis Federation.

OBJECTS

- 3 The objects of the Association shall be as follows:

 (a) To lay down and secure the adoption of uniform laws of the game of Table Tennis in England and to act as the legislative Authority.

 (b) To decide all doubtful or disputed questions as to the laws and all matters relating to the game in England.

 - To act as the sole controlling and governing body and generally to promote and encourage the playing, development and organisation of the game of Table Tennis in
 - To apply solely to the promotion of the foregoing objects all income and property of the Association from whatever source derived.

DEFINITIONS

- The following words and phrases shall throughout the Rules and Regulations of the Association have the meaning assigned to them by this Rule.

 (1) affiliated club: a club in membership of a Local

 - League. affiliated player: any player who is either a Directly Affiliated Individual or in membership of an affiliated (2)

 - body.
 Directly Affiliated Club: a club which pays an affiliation fee direct to the E.T.T.A., whether or not also in membership of a Local League.

- Local League: any organisation or association which runs a competition between teams from clubs in a particular locality. Except where specifically excluded Local League includes Youth League.
- Member: any person mentioned in Rule 5(a), or any official, player or other member of a body mentioned in Rule 5(a), or of a club in membership of or affiliated to such a body.
- Organisation in Good Standing: An organisation which has been given official recognition by the E.T.A. under Rule 5(b), being EITHER an organisation which is not a Table Tennis organisation, but under whose auspices Table Tennis is played, OR a Table Tennis organisation or competition which is not of a type mentioned in Rule 5(a).
- Permit Member: a member of the Association duly registered under the provisions of Rule 43 and the Permit Members Regulations in Appendix "A." School Club: a club the membership of which is restricted to schoolchildren

- Season: The period commencing the day after completion of an Annual General Meeting and ending on the day when the next Annual General Meeting is

- Youth League: a league the membership of which is restricted to persons under 21 years of age and consisting entirely of Youth Clubs or of Youth Clubs and School Clubs.

CONSTITUTION

- 5 (a) The Association shall consist of :-
- Association shall consist of:—
 President, Vice-Presidents, Honorary Life Members and duly elected Officers.
 County Associations.
 affiliated Local Leagues, Directly Affiliated Clubs and Directly Affiliated Individuals.
 affiliated Schools Leagues and Directly Affiliated School Clubs.
 - Other organisations may be accepted into Good Standing at the discretion of the National Council.

AFFILIATION

- 6 (a) The normal unit of affiliation shall be the Local League. Any league playing under the Laws of Table Tennis as approved by the Association shall be eligible for affiliation.
- Additionally any club, or any individual playing under the Laws of Table Tennis as approved by the Association shall be eligible for direct affiliation.
- Every applicant for affiliation to the Association shall complete the current affiliation form and shall sign it on behalf of himself or of the league or club for which application is being made.
- Such form shall then be submitted to the appropriate County Association (if any) which shall indicate whether the application is approved or not.
 - If approval of the application be not given or refused by the County Association within 28 days it shall be deemed to be refused.
 - If approval of the application be refused or deemed refused the applicant may apply to the National Council for the approval of the County Association to be dispensed with. If such an application to the National Council be refused the applicant may appeal to the Board of Appeal.
 - In the event of any aplication or appeal as mentioned in Rule 7(b) (iii) the County Association concerned shall provide a written statement of its reasons for not approving the application. If such statement is not provided the application or appeal shall forthwith be granted or allowed shall forthwith be granted or allowed.
- Every application for affiliation approved by a County Association (if appropriate), or for which such approval shall have been dispensed with, shall be granted or refused by the Management Committee which shall have the power to refuse without giving reasons giving reasons.
 - An applicant may appeal to the National Council against refusal by the Management Committee. For the purpose of this rule refusal shall be deemed if the Management Committee has not accepted or refused within 28 days of the application being made or, if a County Association's consent be necessary, within 28 days of such consent being given or dispensed with dispensed with.

 - Council. A Member by virtue of being an official, player or other member of a body mentioned in Rule 5(a), or of a club in membership of or affiliated to such a body shall be deemed to remain a Member until the earlier of
 - 31st December following the end of the season for which fees or subscription due were last paid by or in respect of him, or during which he was acknowledged by such body to be a member thereof, or
 - the date on which his membership of that body is terminated by specific decision or operation of the Rules of that body.

AFFILIATION FEES

- 9 A Local League shall pay affiliation fees on the basis of the number of teams it has in membership, and the number of players required to make up a team in that league and to provide one reserve player per team.

HANDBOOK

13 Copies of the Association's current Handbook when published shall be supplied free of charge to every County Association, Local League, Directly Affiliated Club, Directly Affiliated Individual and Permit Member.

PRESIDENT AND VICE-PRESIDENTS

The Association shall have a President and not more than 25 Vice-Presidents who shall be elected by the Annual 14 (a) General Meeting.

The President or a Vice-President shall be elected for a term of three years, but shall be eligible for re-election at the end of such term.

Nominations for President and Vice-Presidents shall be submitted only by the National Council.

The President and Vice-Presidents shall hold office from the day following the A.G.M. at which they are elected. The President shall have the right to attend at meetings of the Association including meetings of the National Council and of the Management Committee.

HONORARY LIFE VICE-PRESIDENT

The Association may elect a Life Vice-President, but only past Presidents of the Association shall be eligible.

OFFICERS

The honorary Officers of the Association shall be Chairman, Deputy Chairman, General Secretary (if the post be not suspended in the manner mentioned in Rule 17 (e)) and Treasurer.

All Officers shall retire annually at the end of the Annual General Meeting, but shall be eligible for re-

A casual vacancy in an office shall be filled in the manner set out in Rule 19 so far as applicable, the nomination forms being sent out not later than seven days after the vacancy occurs.

Any challenge to the accuracy of the Electoral Register must be made in writing and received by the General Secretary not later than 20th January or within 7 days of notification of any addition, transfer or deletion.

20 The National Council shall at its discretion have authority to elect additional honorary officials for up to one year and to invite such persons to attend meetings of the National Council, but, unless they already be members of the Council, without right to speak (unless invited to do so) and without vote.

PAID APPOINTMENTS

- The National Council shall have power to create and fill any paid appointment which in its opinion is necessary. The National Council shall approve any contract necessary in connection with such paid appointment and shall authorise the Officers to sign it on behalf of the Association. The contract shall thereupon be binding upon the Association (b) Association.

NATIONAL COUNCIL

- The Association shall, subject to the control of the Annual General Meeting, be governed by a National Council which shall consist of the Officers of the Association (as defined by Rule 17(a)) together with one person representing each County Association elected annually in the manner laid down by Rule 23.

Other resolutions shall be decided by simple majority, and, in the event of a tie, except on financial questions, the meeting shall proceed to the next business. In the matter of finance the chairman shall have a casting vote.

VOTING BY LOCAL LEAGUES AT GENERAL MEETINGS

Any Local League wishing to exercise its own votes at a General Meeting shall give notice in writing to the General Secretary of the Association of its desire so to do not later than 14 days before the date of the General Meeting, such notice being signed by the Secretary and by another responsible officer of the Local League. The General Secretary shall issue an official Voting Card to the Secretary of such Local League not later than seven days before the

date of the meeting.

The votes of every Local League which does not exercise the option granted by Rule 32(a) shall be exercised by the Accredited Representative of the County Association to which such Local League belongs.

SPECIAL GENERAL MEETING

- 33 (a) A Special General Meeting of the Association shall be convened on a resolution of the National Council, or within one month of receipt by the General Secretary of a request signed by the authorised representatives of at least one third of the Local Leagues.
 - Rule 31 respecting circulation of notices and procedure (b) shall apply as for the Annual General Meeting so far as applicable, at least 28 days' notice being given.

COUNTY ADMINISTRATION

- 34 (a) Where a majority of affiliated Local Leagues in any County agree, a body shall be set up for the purpose of admini-stration in the County.
 - The administrative area of a County Association shall (b) be defined primarily by the geographical boundaries of the County in force for the time being.
 - There shall be no County of London, but for the purpose of these Rules the Greater London area shall be divided as follows: be divided as follows:—
 The boroughs of Bexley, Bromley, Greenwich and Lewisham shall be part of Kent.
 The boroughs of Barking, Havering, Newham, Redbridge and Waltham Forest shall be part of Essex.
 The boroughs of Croydon, Kingston, Lambeth, Merton, Richmond-on-Thames, Southwark, Sutton and Wandsworth shall be part of Surrey.
 The boroughs of Barnet, Brent, Camden, Chelsea, City, Faling, Enfield, Hackney, Hammersmith, Har-City, Ealing, Enfield, Hackney, Hammersmith, Haringey, Harrow, Hillingdon, Hounslow, Islington, Kensington, Tower Hamlets and Westminster shall constitute the County of Middlesex.
- A Local League shall affiliate to one County Associa-35 (a) (i) tion only, and shall not transfer or be required to transfer its affiliation from one County Association to another at any time, except as provided in Rule

(ii) A Local League affiliating newly or afresh shall affiliate to the County Association in whose geographical area all or the largest number of its member clubs is situated at the time of application, except as provided in Rules 35(a) (iii) and (iv).
(iii) Where a Local League affiliating newly or afresh has member clubs situated in the geographical areas of two or more County Associations and EITHER it wishes to affiliate to one of those County Associations other than that determined by Rule 35(a) (ii) OR at the time of the application there is no one County Association in the geographical area of which a larger number of its member clubs is situated than in any other County THEN such a Local League may apply to the National Council for permission to affiliate to a County Association of its choice in whose geographical area some of its member clubs are situated. The National Council shall decide such application taking into consideration the views of the Local League and of every County Association in whose geographical area any of the Local League's member clubs is situated.
(iv) Notwithstanding the provisions of Rule 35 (a) (ii) a Local League may with the consent of the County

of the Local League's member clubs is situated.

Notwithstanding the provisions of Rule 35 (a) (ii) a Local League may with the consent of the County Association to which it would be required to affiliate under Rule 35(a) (ii) apply to the National Council for permission to affiliate to some other County Association

Association.

- Where changes in the membership of a Local League having member clubs situated in the geographical area of two or more County Associations result in an alteration of two or more County Associations result in an alteration of the distribution of its member clubs among the geographical areas of such County Associations either the Local League or any of such County Associations may apply to the National Council to approve a transfer of the affiliation of the Local League to some other County Association. The National Council shall decide such application taking into consideration the views of the Local League and of every County Association in whose geographical area any of the Local League's member clubs is situated.
- A Local League continuously affiliated to a County Association other than that defined by Rule 35(a) (i) since before 18th January, 1964, shall have the right to continue to affiliate to that Association.
- Membership of or affiliation to such County Association shall be compulsory for all Local Leagues, Directly Affiliated Clubs, Directly Affiliated Individuals, Schools Leagues and Directly Affiliated School Clubs in the County, except as provided under Rules 34 and 35.

- (ii) All organisations in the County in Good Standing with the E.T.T.A. shall be accepted into Good Standing by the County Association.
- Not later than 30th November each season every County Association shall send to the E.T.T.A. (i) a list of all Local Leagues affiliated to the County Association at the date of the list and (ii) a list of Local Leagues which were so affiliated the previous season but have not renewed their affiliation by the date of the list.
- In any case where the National Council may decide that a In any case where the National Council may decide that a Local League shall not be obliged to affiliate to a County Association, either (1) because no County Association exists in the County concerned or (2) because membership of the Local League concerned is spread over more than one County, an additional fee of 3d. per team place for each team in membership with the said Local League shall be paid to the E.T.T.A. Money so received in case (1) shall be passed to the appropriate County Association if one be formed during the year to which payment relates. if one be formed during the year to which payment relates, but shall otherwise become ordinary E.T.T.A. income. Money so received in case (2) shall be divided in such a manner as the National Council may decide among the County Associations in whose areas the Local League concerned operates.
- 36 The Constitution and Regulations of each County Association and any amendments thereto shall not be valid unless approved by the National Council. Such approval shall be retrospective to the date on which application for approval was made.
- A County Association shall have complete autonomy in organising and administering the game in the county but shall have no power to alter the laws of the game or the rules and regulations of the Association or to over-ride the decisions of the National Council.
 - A County Association shall have power to organise Open and Invitation Tournaments (subject to the sanction of the National Council), Closed Tournaments, County Leagues, County Championships, Inter-League matches and Inter-County Championships. They shall also have power, in conjunction with other County Associations, to run representative matches leagues etc. sentative matches, leagues, etc.
- A County Association shall have power to suspend any Local League, club, player or official within its jurisdiction, and such suspension shall be enforced by all bodies in 38 (a) that County and shall be notified to the General Secretary of the E.T.T.A.
 - On the application of the County Association, the National Council may make the suspension national.
 - Any such suspension shall be subject to a right of appeal to the Board of Appeal.

- 39 A County Association shall be entitled to receive each season
 - from the E.T.T.A. a rebate of 20% in respect of Affiliation Fees paid to the E.T.T.A. by 31st March by Local Leagues, Directly Affiliated Clubs and Directly Affiliated Individuals in membership with such County Association and (i)

 - ciation and A rebate of 20% of the competitors' fees paid to the E.T.T.A. in respect of Tournaments played within the area of such County Association and a rebate of 20% of the fees paid by 31st March by all Permit Members whose application forms were countersigned on behalf of such County Association.

COMPULSORY RULES

- 40 Every County Association shall include in its rules the fol-
 - The County's representative on the National Counrie County's representative of the National Countries and the State of the Country Committee.

 A Local League shall pay affiliation fees on the basis of the number of teams it has in membership and the state of th
 - and the number of players required to make up a team in that league.
 - Schools Leagues and School Clubs may affiliate to
 - the County Association without fee.

 No Member shall without good and sufficient cause absent himself from the Hearing of any allegation or appeal after having been requested with reasonable notice to do so, or refuse to answer any questions put to him in connection with such allegation or appeal if the body hearing the allegation or appeal appeal if the body hearing the allegation or appeal
 - appeal if the body hearing the allegation of appeal direct him to answer.

 Any Local League, club, player or official, may be suspended from the privileges of membership of this Association under the power created by E.T.T.A. Rule 38, subject to the right of appeal provided by E.T.T.A. Rule 60. The E.T.T.A. General Secretary will be notified of any suspension under this Rule.

GENERAL AND DISCIPLINARY

- 41 No affiliated player or club may take part in competition with any player or club, or in exhibition at any club, or under any auspices, not registered or affiliated to the English Table Tennis Association, without the sanction of the County Secretary con-
- 42 No Member or affiliated organisation shall play Table Tennis with or against or take part in any Table Tennis function in conjuction with any suspended organisation or Member.

- 43 Permit Members. The National Council shall have power to make regulations governing the conduct of Permit Members which regulations shall be included in Appendix 'A' to these Rules.
- No payment, other than expenses, shall be made to or received by any Member for playing, coaching, umpiring, writing, filming, broacasting, televising, or for exhibitions or in relation to equipment, unless he has been duly registered as a Permit Member or has received specific permission from the National Council of the English Table Tennis Association to receive it. Application of this Rule may be excused at the discretion of the National Council in respect of writing, filming, broadcasting and televising.

 (b) No Affiliated Organisation or Club shall make any payment other than expenses, to a Member for any of the activities mentioned in Rule 44 (a) unless the Member has been
 - (b) No Affiliated Organisation or Club shall make any payment other than expenses, to a Member for any of the activities mentioned in Rule 44 (a) unless the Member has been registered as a Permit Member or has received specific permission as above. Any affiliated Association or Club making a payment in excess of expenses must, if required by the Secretary of the E.T.T.A. or the County Secretary concerned, report the payment, specifying the amount and the services rendered, within fourteen days of such a request being received.
- 45 (a) No affiliated player shall be paid or receive any remuneration other than expenses (return fare, hotel accommodation and meals) or reward (other than prizes as provided for in the Association's regulations dealing with the Permit Member) for playing in any competitive table tennis event. A competitive table tennis event is one in which a player is playing for his Club, League, County or Country against another Club, League, County or Country, or in an Open, Closed, Invitation, or other Tournament. Trial or representative matches organised by Club, Leagues, Counties or the National Association shall rank as competitive play.
 - (b) No affiliated player shall be paid or receive any reward or remuneration other than expenses (return fares, hotel accommodation, meals) for playing in a representative match or Open Tournament, except as in Rule 46. A representative match is one in which a player is playing for his Club, League, County or Country against any other Team, League, County or Country. Proper Trial Matches organised by Clubs, Leagues, Counties or the National Association for the purpose of selecting representative teams shall rank as participation in Representative matches.
- 46 (a) Prizes of £25 or less in value may be awarded and accepted without special permission other than the general sanction granted for the holding of Open Championships

- (b) Prizes exceeding £25 but not exceeding £100 in value (or not exceeding such lesser sum as the National Council may stipulate) may be awarded and accepted only with the permission of the National Council.
 (c) No prize may exceed £100 in value.
- (c) No prize may exceed £100 in value.
 (d) Badges and colours may be awarded and accepted for participation in representative matches.
- 47 No affiliated player may permit a cinematographic record of himself or herself to be taken in connection with Table Tennis for public exhibition unless sanction has first been obtained from the General Secretary of the Association.
- 48 No affiliated player may enter into a contract in return for capitalising his skill at table tennis without the sanction of the National Council.
- 49 No affiliated player may enter into a contract providing for his exclusive use of certain materials or exclusive play on certain premises controlled by a firm, in any circumstances.
- 50 No affiliated player, organiser or official may take part in a televised event in connection with table tennis unless sanction has first been obtained from the General Secretary of the Association or the event is one authorised by the Association.
- 51 A person gainfully connected with table tennis may occupy an administrative office, or serve on an administrative committee of the Association only provided that he is prepared to withdraw from any meeting or abstain from voting on any issue, on request formally passed by a majority of the meeting he is attending.
- 52 Betting in any shape or form on players or matches is strictly prohibited.
- 53 In all tournaments and matches sanctioned by the National Council, players are prohibited from wearing white or light coloured clothes that might, in the opinion of the duly appointed referee, tend to unsight an opponent.

Recommendation adopted at A.G.M. April, 1952: All competitors are strongly recommended to wear a sports shirt or other top of single colour (except for the badge, of reasonable size), trousers, skirts, or shorts of single colour and rubber shoes. All countles, leagues, local associations and clubs are requested to use their best endeavours to secure compliance with this recommendation. Players representing the Association in an International or other representative match must wear the regulation dress as instructed by the National Council.

54 Only a brand and grade of ball approved by the National Council may be used in play within, between or organised by any organisations which are affiliated or in Good Standing.

55 MISCONDUCT

- Any player having accepted selection by the Association to attend any international match or other event and without good and sufficient cause either refusing to comply with the arrangements of the National Council or any of its sub-committees for playing the match or event, or failing to attend the same, may be adjudged by the National Council to have been guilty of misconduct, and any Member adjudged to have encouraged such player to commit a breach of instruction or rule shall be deemed guilty of a like offence.
- In the event of any act, statement, writing, conduct or matter not provided for elsewhere, which, in the opinion of the National Council is likely to bring the game of Table Tennis into disrepute, the National Council may request the Member responsic a for such act, statement, writing, conduct or matter (hereinafter called "the offender") to give a written undertaking not to repeat such act, statement, writing, conduct or matter, nor to do or commit any similar act, statement, writing, conduct or matter. In similar act, statement, writing, conduct or matter. In default of such undertaking being given within seven days from the sending of a written request to the offender, or if such undertaking is given and there is any breach thereof, then such default or breach shall be misconduct.
- The National Council shall have the power to resolve that any such act, statement, writing, conduct or matter as is mentioned in Rule 55(b) is in itself misconduct and shall be dealt with as such.
- The National Council shall have the power to resolve that any breach of a Regulation of an Open Tournament duly approved by the E.T.T.A. shall constitute misconduct.
- Failure of any Member without good and sufficient cause to attend the Hearing of any allegation or appeal after having been requested with reasonable notice so to do, or failure without good and sufficient cause to answer any question put to him in connection with such allegation or appeal shall be deemed misconduct.
- 56 Upon any breach of these Rules or of the Regulations made thereunder or of any misconduct as defined in these Rules being proved to the satisfaction of the National Council, the Council shall have power to order the Member or organisation guilty of such a breach or misconduct (the offender)
 - (i) To be suspended either indefinitely or for a stated
 - period.
 To be fined (either in addition to suspension or not). To be censured.
 - To be dealt with in such other manner as the
 - National Council may think fit. There shall be no appeal against such decision.

- Any Member or organisation charged with any breach or mis-conduct shall be furnished with details in writing of such charge and shall have the right to a personal Hearing or to make written representations.
- 58 The procedure for dealing with any allegation of breach of Rule or Regulation or misconduct shall be determined by the National Council and shall be included in Appendix 'E' to

APPEALS

- APPEALS

 Any individual or club aggrieved by a decision or action of a Local League, or a Committee or Officer of such League, may appeal against any such decision or action to the County Association to which such Local League is affiliated, or if there be no such County Association, to the National Council of the E.T.T.A., and the decision of the body to which the appeal is made shall be final and binding on all parties.
- 60 (a) Any individual, club or Local League aggrieved by a decision or action of a County Association, or a Committee or Officer of such Association (except the determination of an Appeal) or any individual, club, Local League or County Association aggrieved by a decision or action of the E.T.T.A., or the National Council, or a Committee or Officer of the E.T.T.A. (except a decision under Rule 56), may appeal against any such decision or action to the Board of Appeal of the E.T.T.A. to the Board of Appeal of the E.T.T.A.
 - The Board of Appeal shall consist of eight persons appointed by the National Council but not being members of the Council.
 - The procedure for matters being dealt with by the Board of Appeal shall be determined by the Board and a copy of the Regulations governing such procedure shall be supplied to any organisation or Member making any appeal under these Rules.
 - Each appeal shall be determined by three members of the Board of Appeal selected by the Management Committee, who shall also designate one of the three as Chairman.
 - The Board shall decide the appeal, except that, where the appeal would be upheld on a technicality only, or due to a procedural irregularity by the body appealed against, then the Board may remit the matter to be dealt with afresh by the body appealed against, with a direction regarding the technicality or procedural irregularity.
 - Where the appeal is against disciplinary action the Board shall have the power to vary the punishment imposed.
 - The decision of the Board shall be final and binding on all parties.

- (h) The decision of the Board shall be published forthwith, and a written minute of the decision shall be sent to the appellant and all other parties to the appeal.
- 61 Any such appeal (as provided for by Rules 59 and 60) shall be made in writing to the General Secretary of the appropriate body within 21 days of the decision or action appealed against, and shall be accompanied by a fee of 10/- (50p) in the case of an individual or £2 in the case of an organisation which shall be returned if the adjudicating body consider the making of an appeal to have been justified (whatever the result). Either party to the appeal shall be entitled to be heard by the adjudicating body, both in person, and, if so desired, additionally by a representative who shall have been nominated in writing.
- 62 Whilst any appeal is pending the decision against which the appeal has been made shall not have effect. An appeal shall be deemed to be pending from the time notice of appeal is received by the appropriate person.
- 63 The Rules of the Association being sufficient to enable the National Council, as the governing body of the game of Table Tennis in England, or the Board of Appeal to deal with all cases of dispute, legal proceedings shall be taken only as a last resort, after the full procedure laid down by these Rules and any Regulations made thereunder shall have been followed through.
- 64 The Association shall be entitled to publish in the public Press, or in any other manner it shall think fit, reports of its proceedings, acts and resolutions, whether the same shall or shall not, reflect upon the character or conduct of any league, club or Member, and every such league, club or Member shall be deemed to have assented to such publication.

TOURNAMENTS

- 65 (a) The National Council shall have power to make regulations defining categories of tournaments, and governing the the conduct and organisation of such tournaments as may be specified. Such regulations shall be included in Appendix 'B' to these Rules.
 - (b) Every tournament shall come within one of the categories defined by the National Council in Appendix 'B', and the National Council shall have power to decide in which category any particular tournament shall be placed.
 - (c) No Open or Invitation Tournament shall be held without the sanction of the National Council. Application for running an Open or Invitation Tournament shall be submitted to the appropriate County Association (if any) who shall forward the application to the National Council with their recommendations.

ENGLISH OPEN CHAMPIONSHIPS

- 66 The English Open Championships may be held once every year and when so held:—
 - (a) The date and venue shall be fixed and notice of same circulated as in Rule 31(b) not later than December 31st each year
 - (b) Twelve Championships shall be held as follows: Men's Singles, Men's Doubles, Women's Singles, Women's Doubles, Mixed Doubles, Junior Singles (Boys), Junior Singles (Girls), Junior Doubles (Boys), Junior Doubles (Girls), Junior Mixed Doubles and Men's and Women's Veteran's Singles, and in addition a Men's and Women's Consolation Singles event for competitors eliminated in the first two played rounds of the Singles Championships. A walkover but not a bye shall rank as a played round. It shall be in the power of the National Council to decide, in any year, to hold Junior Championships events separately from the Senior Championships.
 - (c) All matches in the Championships shall be the best of five games, with the exception of the Junior Singles (Boys), Junior Singles (Girls), Junior Doubles (Boys), Junior Doubles (Girls), Junior Mixed Doubles, Veterans' and Consolation events, which shall be best of three games.
 - (d) Such of the regulations in Part II of Appendix 'B' as are specified in Part IV of Appendix 'B' shall apply to the English Open Championships.

ENGLISH CLOSED CHAMPIONSHIPS

- 67 The English Closed Championships may be held once every year and when so held:—
 - (a) Five Championships shall be held as follows: Men's Singles, Men's Doubles, Women's Singles, Women's Doubles and Mixed Doubles. In addition a Men's and Women's Consolation Singles shall be held for competitors eliminated in the first two played rounds of the Singles Championships. A walkover but not a bye shall rank as a played round.
 - (b) All matches in the Championships shall be best of five games with the exception of the Men's and Women's Consolation Singles event, which shall be the best of three games.
 - (c) Such of the regulations in Part II of Appendix 'B' as are specified in Part V of Appendix 'B' shall apply to the English Closed Championships.

ALTERATION OF RULES

- 68 (a) These Rules and the Laws of the Game, as approved by the Association, may be changed (whether by addition, alteration or deletion) only by decision of an Annual General Meeting or of a Special General Meeting convened for the purpose.
 - (b) Proposals for such changes to be considered by the next Annual General Meeting shall be submitted in writing to reach the General Secretary not later than the last day in February. All proposals so received shall be circulated to all County Associations and Local Leagues during March and amendments or alternative proposals dealing with the same substance shall be accepted for consideration by the Annual General Meeting if submitted in writing and received by the General Secretary not later than the last day in April.
- (c) Proposals for such changes to be considered by a Special General Meeting shall be submitted to the General Secretary in writing together with the demand for that Special General Meeting.
- (d) Unless resolved otherwise by the meeting, any alteration to a Rule dealing with Affiliation Fees or other revenue, or with the rebate paid to County Associations shall take effect on the first day of the season next but one after that in which was held the meeting at which it was passed.
- (e) Except as provided by Rule 68(d), any alteration to a Rule shall take effect on the first day of the season following that in which was held the meeting at which it was passed, unless resolved otherwise by such meeting.

MATTERS NOT COVERED BY RULES

- 69 In the event of any question or matter arising which is not provided for in the Rules, such question or matter shall be dealt with by the National Council whose decision shall be final.
- 70 (a) Any communication to be sent by the Association to any person or organisation shall be properly sent if addressed to such person or to the General Secretary of such organisation at his last known address.
 - (b) A County Association, Local League or club shall on demand supply to the General Secretary or other Officer of the Association the last known address of any Member who is a member of such County Association, Local League or club
- NOTE—The Rules have been re-numbered. A schedule showing the old numbering related to the new numbering is available from the Secretary of the Rules Committee.

The next four ranked players or pairs (seeds 13 to 16) shall be drawn by lot into the top places of the second and sixth eighths and the bottom places of the third and seventh eighths. Draw by lot may be dispensed with, however, where necessary to secure separation of Association entries in accordance with the Regulations for seeding by Association."

 - (b) A Member may play within the areas under the jurisdiction of the Guernsey Table Tennis Association, the Irish Table Tennis Association, the Jersey Table Tennis Association, the Scottish Table Tennis Association and the Table Tennis Association of Wales without obtaining permission under Regulation 1(a) unless he is a member of the 'E.T.T.A. International Squad.'

- 2 A Member may apply for and the National Council may grant such permission limited to one event or activity, or covering a number of events or activities or a specified period of time.
- 3 A Member may receive expenses or other remuneration in connection with playing, participating in exhibitions or coaching outside England only if permission, specific to each occasion, shall have been previously requested and received in writing from the E.T.T.A."

Amendments to Appendix 'E'

- 8 Insert new Regulation as follows:
 - 3A At all times a quorum of three members shall be present.
- 9 Insert new Regulation as follows:
 - 3B The Chairman of the Disciplinary Committee shall have the power to impose suspension covering the period from the alleged breach or misconduct until the procedure under this Appendix shall have been carried out.
- 10 Delete Regulation 10 and insert as follows:
 - 10 On the completion of the evidence the Hearing shall be closed and the Committee shall give its decision.
 - 11 The decision shall subsequently be communicated in writing by the General Secretary of the Association to the Member or organisation charged and any other Member or organisation concerned, and such decision shall be deemed to be a decision of the Association and binding on all Members and affiliated bodies.

AMENDMENTS TO THE LAWS OF TABLE TENNIS

- 11 Replace sentences 1, 2, 3 and 5 of Law 6 (page 110 of E.T.T.A. Handbook 1968/69 Part I) by the following:
 - The ball shall be placed on the palm of the free hand, which must be stationary, open and flat, with the fingers together and the thumb free. The free hand, while in contact with the ball in service, shall at all times be above the level of the playing surface.
 - Service shall then begin by the server projecting the ball by hand only, without imparting spin, near vertically upwards, so that the ball is visible at all times to the umpire and so that it visibly leaves the palm.
 - As the ball is then descending from the height of its trajectory it shall be struck so that it touch first the server's court and then, passing directly over or around the net, touch the receiver's court. At the moment of the impact of the racket on the ball in service, the ball shall be behind the end-line of the server's court or an imaginary extension thereof.

12 On page 111 of E.T.T.A. Handbook 1968/69 Part 1, at end of Notes to Law 6, add new note 5:

WARNING: It is the responsibility of the server to serve so that the correctness of his service can be checked by the umpire. If the server is serving so that the umpire's view is obstructed, the umpire shall warn him and, on any subsequent occasion on which his view is obstructed, and he may have doubt about the correctness of the service, the umpire shall call a fault.

13 Add the following note at the end of the Laws:

Note: The Laws as printed on pages 109-114 are a condensed version of 'e full I.T.T.F. Laws, and were adopted for general play in E gland by the 1968 Annual General Meeting of the E.T.T.A. Oppies of the full Laws, under which all International Matches and Open Tournaments are conducted, may be obtained from the E.T.T.A. Office, price 2/6d.


