Denise, who helped England Cadets to fifth place at the European Youth Championships in 2016, won doubles silver at the Belgium Junior & Cadet Open this year.







Drinkhall remembers his experience at the Europe Youth Top 10 very well.

He said: "It was a great event to help me break into the Seniors. It's a very difficult one because you only play against the other top players, but it you win then it's a big confidence boost.

"Events like the Top 10 help how you think about things. You have to be focused for every game and it tests your mental strength.

"Some great players have won it, but a lot who just competed in it but didn't win still went on to be strong senior players."

the tournament which sees the cream of European Youth pitting their skills against each other was first run in 1985 when it was known as the Europe Junior Top 12, Juniors at that time were under 17 years.

It was a most successful event for England as Carl Prean took the inaugural Boys' title and Andrew Syed finished in eighth place – a most impressive win for Carl, who won all his matches without dropping a game and pushed Jean-Michel Saive of Belgium into second place. The Girls' event was won by Olga Nemes of Federal Germany.

Originally, this event was only for Junior players but in 2008, when England hosted the tournament at the English Institute of Sport in Sheffield, Cadet events were added to the programme with a reduction to 10 players per event. It is perhaps the most challenging of tournaments with the best in Europe playing each other over a demanding three days.

The first English female player to qualify was Andrea Holt in 1988, who finished in 10th place. In all there have been seven English girls who have played by qualification. The most successful have been Joanna Parker (Drinkhall), who finished sixth in 2005 and more recently Tin-Tin Ho who has had two fifth places; one in the Cadet event in 2013 and one in the Junior event in 2014. Tin-Tin also finished sixth in the Juniors in 2016.

Eleven boys have represented England, with Paul Drinkhall being the most successful. Twenty-two years on from Carl's win, Paul stood at the top of the podium in Riga, Latvia in 2007 in a very cold and snowy January. On home soil the following year, Paul finished with a medal but this time it was coloured bronze. Paul

also played in 2006 when he finished ninth.

Gavin Evans too had success in the Cadet Boys, in 2008, when he finished third. The following year he moved up to the Junior age group and finished ninth.

Matthew Syed was three times a contestant, finishing fifth, seventh and 10th, Darius Knight similarly competed three times finishing sixth, ninth and 11th. The only other boy to qualify more than once was Michael O'Driscoll, who finished in fifth and seventh places.
